It's cold and cruel stuff to handle, and perhaps we are not sure yet about the best way to


handle it.





Following it's recent 50th anniversary celebrations, the Board of St. Marys District Hospital wishes to thank the people of the community for supporting its celebrations.

As the name implies, the hospital belongs to the district and the support of the public is a vital part of the hospital's success over the past half century. The present Board believes that the hospital must become more community oriented over the next few years; to be less of an "institution on the hill" and more of a "community health centre" in which people can be involved in a direct way.

The public is already involved in the running of the hospital by virtue of local residents being the Board of Management. The Board members are representatives of the community, giving the community a direct voice in the hospital's administration. Any member of the community can, therefore, effectively become involved by talking with Board members and making the community opinions, expectations and desires known to the members.

There are seven people on the hospital Board. Five are appointed there by the Minister of Health and two are elected locally, one being elected from the Council and one being elected from the Ladies Auxiliary.

The term of the Board is two years, so each two years the Minister either makes new appointments or reappoints the same people. The present Board's term expires in June '78 and its members are Allan Jackson Chairman,
