

For a life you might have found.


Or rush off to your Doctor,

Norman Sutton won by only three eighths of an ounce to take second prize. Just for the record, Norman's cocky salmon weighed 8 ounces, so you can work out the weight of the other two fish. All three placegetters are regular competitors, but it was Norman's first trophy since August 1976 & Bob's first for two & a half years. There must be some moral in this, perhaps the tortoise and the hare or is it the big bull and the little bull? Only nine fish were caught on the day.





NEW STATE PRESIDENT FOR R.S.L.

Mr. Tom Walker of Launceston will become State President of the R.S.L. in the New Year. A long time member and office bearer, Mr. Walker was elected Deputy-State President in August, 1977. He has been the Vice President for Bass for several years. Prior to this he was President of the Devonport Sub Branch for 8 years.

Mr. Walker's move from Devonport to his present position as Principal of the Launceston Technical College resulted in him transferring to the Launceston Sub Branch. He was President of Launceston Legacy for 1976/77. The retiring State President, Mr. Jim Patterson, was elected in May 1974 when he was President of the Hobart Sub Branch. 


