Fishing along the East Coast.

Tasmanian saltwater fishermen have a year long season. In January anglers are still enjoying the tail end of the bream fishing in the estuaries, particularly along the East Coast.

At the same time the game fishermen are looking for the start of the striped tuna run which is then around Flinders Island and possibly s far south as St. Helens and Bicheno.

As the summer months of February and March appear the fishing activity increased because the waters off the East Coast are warm with the tropical current swinging down in a light greenish/blue arc along the shelf off the coastline.

Striped tuna and albacore tuna will be about in schools with the occasional bluefin taking the jig with a wham.

Off the shore anglers expect the first of the garfish and Australian salmon schools to blacken the surface as they move along the coast.

Flathead will be on the bite

Flathead will be on the bite but the larger king flatties will lot come shoreward for a few weeks yet, a little rough weather will be needed first.

April, May and June will see the striped and albacore tuna give way to bigger southern bluefin and towards the end of this period and into July some huge fish will be expected.

Every year the world record seems to be under threat from bigger and bigger bluefin, whilst the shark fishermen, particularly those that fish for the big make and tiger shark will have their wish.

Along the shore the "gummy"
shark, skate and larger flatties
will be evident whilst mullet,
mackerel, sweetfish or luderick and
the like will all be available for
the rock and beach fishermen.

Early spring sees a rebirth of activity as the silver bream start to come on bite again building up to a peak near the end of October but evident through until about December/January in sufficient numbers to make fishing profitable.

The second run of Australian salmon, garfish and barracoutta will be evident as the warm current leaves us until next year, and may feel this early spring run of these school fish is the best run of all.

To Cook a Husband.





The meeting was well attended with people from all parts of the Municipality and some guests from St. Helens.


The Warden (Mr.A.Freeman) was chairman. Mr. George Shaw M.L.C. and Mrs.Shaw were present. Mr Shaw spoke of the Club Reports commending them for the demonstration of a community working together to make a place happier to live in. He was pleased to note that the Home Units were now a reality in St.Marys and pledged his support for any other developments.

Reports from the Clubs were read by Mrs A.Legro (Fingal), Mrs U, Camplin (Cornwall), Mr. J.Spilsbury (St.Marys) and the Meels on Wheels (Rev.Father Jarrett). Father Jarrett paid a tribute to Mr . Kevin Crowden the Secretary of the Meels on Wheels who is shortly to leave the District. Mr. Tim McManus delighted the meeting with a splendid arrangement of slides and commentary on Bruny Island and the Guest speaker for the evening Monsignor B.C.Rogers of Lindisfarne spoke on his home in Northern Ireland and on the situation prevailing there. He said he couldn't blame anyone for

He illustrated movements current there which don't get a mention such as PRO-CAT where a Presbyterian Employer had established his busniss employing equal numbers of propostant and catholic workers, manufacturing a very high class Crystal Ware. And in Gleneyre there was a place where people prayed together, and also in Belfast 10,000 people were praying together. 
