FRIENDS

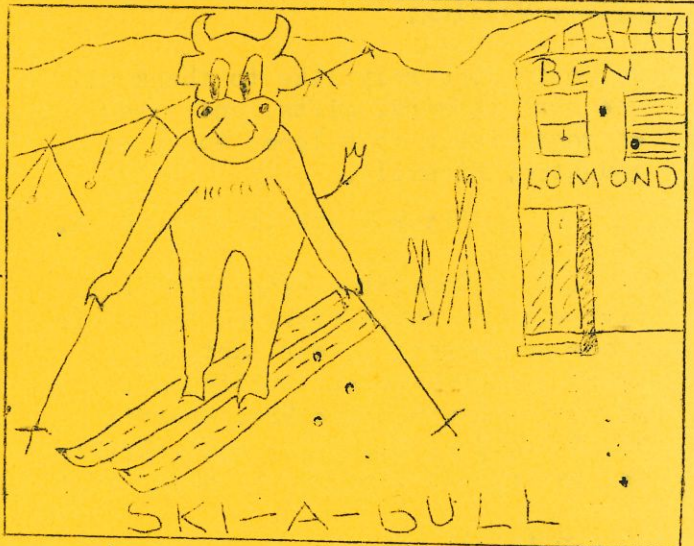

The Staff of the Valley Voice offer their deepest sympathy to Mr. & Mrs. Dean and family and Mr. & Mrs. Ken Lohrey and family in the loss of Simon.

Rowing representatives from several Australian States attended the funeral on the 9th June 1977, of the champion young Tasmanian rower Simon Dean, who died suddenly on Sunday 5th June 1977.

Simon aged 24 years was holidaying at Falmouth with his Grandparents. He died while walking on the beach with close friend Shanne McGuinness, a top Tasmanian oarswoman. Simon recently returned to Tasmania after two years in Sydney. He was recognised as one of the best rowers to come out of Tasmania. Simon began rowing with Taroona High and the Sandy Bay Rowing Club in 1968 and rose through the rowing ranks to represent Australia in the 1975 world championships in Nottingham, England.

His five seasons with Sandy Bay laid the foundations for a brilliant rowing career. In his first season Simon won the club's most promising schoolboy oarsman trophy and a year later stroked the club's State Champion eight oared pair.

At the end of only his second season in rowing he was selected in Tasmania's King Cup squad - and repeated this feat in 1971, 1973, 1974 and 1975.

Simon was Sandy Bay's most successful oarsman in the 1973-74 season and in May 1973 competed in the inter-varsity eight-oared

championships at Mildura.

In November and December 1974, a series of contests for Australasian coxless eights were held in New Zealand and Simon stroked the Tasmanian Crew which successfully competed throughout the series. In 1975 Simon was a Mercury Star Of Sport. His father accepted the award on behalf of Simon who then, was preparing for the world championship.



Dear Editor,

One of the main criticism of conservationists, is that, they are all educated living in cities with easy well paid jobs and that all they want to do is preserve as much wildness as they can for their own selfish benefit. The wildness visitor is basically motivated by a deep spiritual hunger. Perhaps it is logical that these people should come from the affluent sectors of our society. Perhaps their presence is yet another glaring symptom of the way that our society, with its accent on material growth and possession acquisition, cannot satisfy the basic spiritual needs of mankind. Even the church, these days, seems to have lost or hidden the spiritual side of life so that many drift away. Nearly every society and primitive culture has had some all-absorbing religion, spiritual philosophy or the like. Only in the last few hundred years with the advent of capitalism and communism, have societies been starved of spiritual satisfaction. Hence the problems we see today. Delinquency, crime, loneliness, moral perversion, broken homes, all point to the basic spiritual sickness of our society. I believe, therefore, that we should encourage movements towards the spiritual side of life. Upholders of wilderness are just one other movement in this direction. Hence, wilderness seekers should not be condemned out of hand as "emotional" and "selfish". They, at least, are giving voice (usually misunderstood) to a need which I believe is universal.
