EDITORIAL

Darwin 13th February 1977

Twice in 1976 we were given furniture by your organisation. You didn't question our beliefs, nor ask about our financial situation. Just to know we lost our things during the cyclone was enough for you. It meant a lot to us. But more especially we are thankful for the dignity you gave us when handling the matter. Our English is clumsy to convey exactly our feelings - hope you'll understand anyway. Yours sincerely.....

This is a typical letter received from people wishing to express their appreciation for the assistance given them by The Salvation Army, help that is only possible because of the generosity YOU show each year when you make your contribution to the Red Shield Appeal. The graphic for this years Appeal Campaign is symbolic of hardship and hope. The twisted ball of wire is symbolic of man's suffering, hardship and pain. TASMANIAN GOVERNMENT YOUTH SUPPORT PROGRAMME

Functions of this programme are:

1. To ensure that employment guidance and self-help systems are provided.
2. To confer and collaborate with employers and unions on ways of helping young people to adjust to the work situation, and to promote the development of formal induction and orientation programmes to assist the transmission from school/college to work.
3. To promote and assist in the provision of relevant prevocational courses and programmes, and guided work experience programmes, for young people and in particular, those currently unemployed.
4. To stimulate work opportunities, particularly those which may lead to permanent employment.
5. To liaise closely with the Federal Depts. of Soc. Sec. and Employment and Industrial Relations and provide advice and assistance to young unemployed people on their entitlements to unemployment benefits and opportunities under the National Employment and Training and Community Youth Support Scheme.
6. To arrange programmes of further education and development, and simulated work experience, to assist unemployed young people.
7. To encourage and assist District & Secondary Schools and Colleges to devise career education programmes.

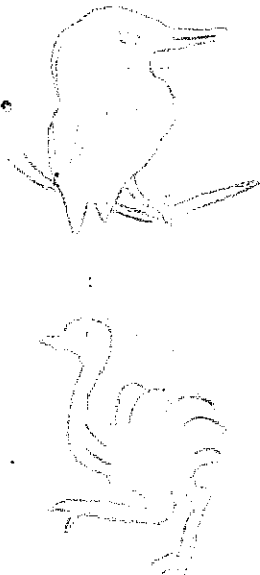
