GOOD MANNERS.

A famous and long-established school has carved over its entrance, the words "MANNERS MAYKETH MAN". The idea contained in these three words will, to some people seem as quaint as the old fashioned spelling.

It can be argued that good manners form so small a part of daily living that their absence would scarcely be noticed. Also, present day man is so brilliantly clever that if there is any making to be done, he will do it, and this applies as much to codes of manners as to space-ships.

Furthermore, this is the age of efficiency - of "getting on" and "going places". We are all so frantically busy that to find time to say "please" and "thankyou" is difficult. To say "after you" is more difficult still; who would forgo his place in the queue after striving so hard to secure it?

A little thought might, however, convince us that the more we have to do and the less time to do it, the more we collide and grate on other people. Common courtesy might then be as important as lubricating oil in a fast running engine. Not much is needed, but lack of it may cause over-heating and a seize-up.

Should we favour good manners, in ourselves and in our associates, how are they taught if acquired? Let us use the analogy of a horse in this period which follows a Tasmanian victory in the Melbourne Cup. Can a successful and well behaved horse be produced by putting a foal out to range for several years without guidance, example or persuasion? Surely the opposite: the foal would become intractable, wilful and maybe vicious. Our young people, similarly, need the example of their elders in order that good manners may become habitual.

Our society is subject to stresses from many sources.





Annual Report For Year Ending
June 16 - 1977

As President I am pleased to report our Branch has functioned very efficiently again this year. Our total membership is 28 and it is only because of their excellent attendance to Red Cross in general that we can offer the service expected from us.

RED CROSS BLOOD BANK has again operated successfully but more donors are urgently required in the future. Our thanks to all donors and helpers who attended during the four visits of Blood Bank.

ANNUAL AMBULANCE APPEAL was once again in outstanding success having raised the all time record sum of \$1973.44. This achievement is something our branch, collectors and donors can be very proud of and is greatly appreciated. The response suggests that donors are becoming more aware of the need and service given by our free ambulance. I would like to thank the St. Marys Lions Club for their very generous donation of \$250 which increased our total immensely.

THE AMBULANCE this year was used on 89 trips and covered a total mileage for the year of 12,064 miles. The cost of running the service was; garage cost for year \$1349.01; 11.18 cents per mile. Driving cost for the year \$638.00; 5.29 cents per mile. A total cost per mile of operation 16.47 cents which compares favourably with 14.92 cents last year.

DRIVERS Once again our thanks go to the voluntary ambulance drivers. They are greatly appreciated by our branch and those who have been unfortunate enough to require the service.

Without the co-operation of drivers our branch would find it difficult to continue our free ambulance service. Thanks to our Matron and Hospital Staff for their never ending assistance and supply of trained staff to staff our ambulance when required.

In closing I would like to thank the people of the Fingal Valley for their great support.

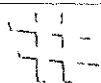
