My neighbour came in after baking with a basin of eggshells which I quickly cast over the compost with the air of a priestess sprinkling holy water. After that there came a regular supply of suitable stuff in the form of fish heads, lawn clippings and general kitchen trash, cementing the bonds of neighborliness in the pleasantest manner. We'd drink coffee in that corner of the garden and walk round the heap, noting with interest the changes in shape, size and colour. I called it "heap-watching". When we went mushrooming I was happy to add dried cowpats collected from the paddocks. Well, after further layers of stuff that had once lived, and a final sprinkling of earth and lime, I felt the time had come to lay boards over the lot and let it mature. This I did. Then one day in early Spring I spread the finished product, barrow-load by barrow-load, over the garden plot. Leaning on my rake I looked with pride and a real sense of fulfilment at the carpet of compost - rich, dark and altogether satisfactory. When my husband came home I showed him the garden, "Next week," I said, "I'll start planting." He grinned and looked at me in a peculiar way. "I've got news," he said. "I've been transferred. We'll be leaving at the end of the month...." Now, in another part of the country, I get letters from my former neighbour. She writes that the people in our place grow superb vegetables and have taken prizes at the local show with carrots, cucumbers, tomatoes and extra large pumpkins.

COUNCIL NEWS

ST. MARYS WARD

This report is the first of a series of reports from Ward Councillors on Ward business, which it is hoped, will bring to ratepayers a flow of information to generate comments and co-operation within the ward.

1. Scamander Water: Portland and Fingal Councils have made an agreement to spend approximately \$16,000 to enlarge and improve the Scamander water system. It is hoped the works will be completed within this calendar year. Obviously Council doesn't have this money in hand and the scheme will be financed by borrowings.

2. St. Marys Water: Over the next four to five weeks residents are asked to note water quality to assess any improvement. Ward Councillors have, as a short term measure, arranged an alteration to supply following engineering advice. The water quality is expected to improve within a week or so and from then it should maintain its improved quality for the period of the examination. A long term solution has been proposed and will be investigated (as to cost, supply, quality etc.) during the next four to five weeks.

3. St. Marys Rubbish Tip: A Clean-up is expected within a few days. The use of the tip will be a subject of the next report.
