HOW THE NEW BUDGET WILL AFFECT US ALL

Well, to start with, food will go up in price, as such a lot is carted by road, and freight costs will rise as the cost of petrol is to rise. The cut in sales tax on cars isn't much good with the increase in petrol prices. Holiday and Long Service pay, or lump sums paid in lieu of long service leave or annual holidays not taken, are now to be taxed as part of the normal income. All long service leave entitlements earned after Budget night will be taxed at the minimum rate of 33½%, it's not retrospective to before Budget night. The tax on holiday entitlements is. For those taxpayers (mainly those who are self-employed) the changes are important. The tax commissioners can now penalise a provisional taxpayer if he under-estimates taxable income by more than 10%. Previously the margin was 20%. The tax department will soon have the legal power to force employers to deduct pay-as-you-earn tax from the part-time or full-time earnings of entertainers, musical groups and casual building workers. Of course all this increases unemployment, so children leaving school need to learn about work, in fact two or more jobs, so they don't have all their eggs in one basket. The T.E.C. advises students that the courses which they undertake ought to attempt to fit them for a range of occupations so that should they have options when they complete their course but they should also have the capacity to change their occupations during their working lives.

GET FIT

The papers are full of examples of how to be fit; do the exercises shown & you will bulge with muscles; your body will be in top condition; you can walk up the steepest hill without effort, you will be so fit. But who supposes his or her mind is also unfit, there are no advertisements on how to develop the muscles of our minds, and minds have a lot beside muscles that are of paramount importance. Mental organs are really far less efficient than they ought to

Find something that interests you, study it for about 10 minutes, then try to write about what you have studied for another 10 minutes. Keep this up every day, 20 minutes a day, and you will be surprised. An accurate knowledge of any subject, coupled with a carefully nurtured sense of the relativity of that subject to other subjects, implies a great deal of self development.

ST. MARYS WARD

At it's last meeting Council decided it's rates for 78/79. The good news is that most people in St. Marys and Cornwall townships should pay less than last year, despite an increase of half a cent in the total rate. The reduction will be because last year's levy for the Rural Fire Brigade has been deleted this year.

Some examples:

If you paid \$100 last year, this year you pay about \$97.
If you paid \$120 last year, this year you pay about \$117.
If you paid \$150 last year, this year you pay about \$148.
If you paid \$200 last year, this year you pay about \$198.
If you paid over \$300 last year your rates will be a bit higher this year.

Scamander township rates will on average be a little amount dearer this year as water charges have been raised. Plans for the improvements to Scamander water are progressing quite well and work should begin shortly. The cost is now estimated at about \$180,000 by completion.

If you take advantage of the 5% discount period your payment will be reduced.

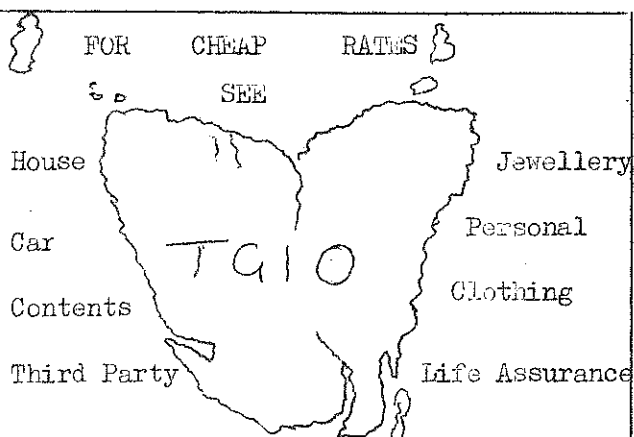
