## LAND TAX

There has been some uneducated moaning by some sectional interests regarding the state Land Tax rates. As is usual, the loudest moans come from the owners of the most lucrative sites in the state who feel they have been singled out for unjust tax.

Land tax is the best of all possible taxes as economists from Ricardo to Galbraith always admit; and that covers centuries of economic study. The State land tax scales may need amendment to remove some inequalities in application but in no circumstances should it be abolished completely, as some misinformed, headline-snatching, opposition members have been reported advocating.

The proposition of land tax is simple. If you want exclusive right to a piece of Tasmania, you should pay Tasmania a fair tax for the privilege. By doing so, you pay the fairest tax yet devised, and which is agreed to be so by every political economist; provided it is comprehensive and the solitary tax.

There is no doubt that the present system of taxation used by the States and the Commonwealth is an absurd arrangement. In a recent weekly journal there was a feature on the Australian taxation system.

Firstly there was an article on the 'Tax Avoidance Industry'. An increasing number of people are resorting to taxation agents to find loopholes for avoiding (not evading) tax. Meanwhile the taxation office is setting up more efficient methods to track down the unco-operative taxpayers.

Then there was an article about the chances of wage and salary earners to minimise the tax grab. The chances were very limited indeed.

A further article dealt with small businesses. There was more scope here.

Next an interview with well known tax dodger Peter Clyne who recommended non-compliance, namely not sending returns. This is a delaying tactic but Clyne says if thousands did it the tax system would be in turmoil.

All these examples of 'civil disobedience' are hardly surprising when you consider the absurdities and complexities of our taxation system. It has become so bad, even the 'experts' cannot keep abreast of all the ramifications and ambiguities.

Then followed an interview with the Federal Treasurer who qualifies for my prize for the 'blind leading the blind'. Certificate of Incompetency.

Looking at our present national revenue landscape, the words of William Shakespeare come to mind..."Whom the gods would destroy, they first make mad."

## FISHING

Angler's Diary:- Sunday 9th December - Scamander Angling Club Surf contest at Wrinklers from 11am to 4pm. The annual Swansea bream and surf competition was a success this year. By introducing the mystery weight, the opportunity for winning by dubious means was severely restricted and the innovation was welcomed by most anglers. In addition, increased supervision of fishing both in the river and on the bay was also an improvement on previous years. Anglers from the Scamander Club have been strangely modest on their prowess in this event. However, congratulations are in order for Jack Sweet, son Michael and Rupert McGee for winning the teams event. There are still no reports of tuna being caught, but with all this mild weather, the water temperature must be slowly rising and these fish should not be far away from our coast. The A.B.C. news has reported the foundation of a Tasmanian Amateur Fishing Association, something which is long overdue. Local clubs have not been approached so far, but enquiries are being made. A combined voice carries much more weight in the corridors of power than single ones. A local problem which could well be investigated by such an organisation is the right of anglers to have access to the Scamander River. It appears that, if you do not own a boat, there are many parts of the river where the angler is unable to fish because access is prohibited by landowners. Action is being taken by the Club to have this position clarified.
