#### THE AUSTRALIAN-WEW ZEALAND RELATIONSHIP.

There has always been a strong tradition of close contact & cooperation between Australia & New Zealand. The fact that both countries were colonized by Britainmentary delegations & covernment has given each similar political & officials, regular consultations administrative structures. The on international legal matters, close relationship between Aust. since then.

Conscious decisions at government level have formulated policies to maximize cooperation & consultation between Australia & New Zealand. In 1944 the ANZAC Pact was signed pledging unity of effort in peace & in war. Further, in 1965 expansion of trans-Tasman trade was fostered by the New Zealand Free Trade Agreement (NAFTA). This two-way trade between Australia & New Zealand is now worth over \$1 billion annually. Each country is the other's most important export market for manufactured products. However, trade has to be closely monitored, especially dairy & venetable products, & carpets can have serious repercuss-

ions on Tasmanian industries.
The special relationship between Australia & New Zealand is maintained by regular & frequent con-sultation between Ministers & officials, covering most areas of gov ernment activity. While each country has drawn on a similar heritage, in recent years there has been a growing influx of new settlers of non-Anglo Saxon origin.

Inevitably Australia & New Zealand have each developed some sep- Christmas New Year Holiday Feriod. arate & distinctive national identities which result in differences in attitudes & emphasis, but these exist alonside the wide range of common interests & values of the two countries so that there is an overall atmoshpere of mutual understanding & sympathy existing between them.

In 1978 the Nareen Declaration was issued by Mr. Fraser, Austral-

ian Prime Minister, & Mr. Talboys, New Zealand Deputy Prime Minister & Minister of Foreign Affairs & Overseas Trade. This reaffirmed the need for continued cooperation & outlined further areas of consultation such as exchanges of parliainternational economic & trade & New zealand was forged at issues & development cooperation.

#### T - JUNCTIONS.

A new road traffic rule governing T-junctions is to be introduced Austrialia - wide from Sunday, March 1. The new rule will require drivers approaching a T-junction on the terminating road, (the stem of the T.) to give way to any vehicle which has entered or is approaching the junction from the continuing road (the bar of the T.) They said the new rule would apply to all three-way intersections. To aid the motorist, steps are being taken to ensure that three-. way intersections which differ significantly from the single T. pattern, such as Y intersections, will be made safer by the use of tfaffic signals, give-way stop signs, or through the realignment of the intersection, they said

#### A LETTER TO THE EDITOR

Dear Sir,

Re: Angle Parking Provisions

You will be aware that angle parking was introduced at St. Marys. To this time no individual car places have been marked on the pavement. As a result, cars are tend-in, to park at various angles reducing the potential number of car parking places. I would be grateful if you would arrange to have this marking done, as soon as possible.

In addition, ears are driving frontwards into the parking bays. This necessitates them having to back out into the stream of traffic. It has been suggested to me that it is illegal for cars to back in this way, and it would be very much safer if cars were to back into the parking bays and thus drive out frontwards into the traffic lanes.

I should be grateful if you would consider this suggestion and, if appropriate, make the change when the parking bays are being marked on the pevement.
