LINK ROAD REPORT

The Four Mile Creek Road is first mentioned in Department of Main Roads' records with a petition in 1937 asking that the road and the bridge at Four Mile Creek be repaired. The request was not granted as the road was in so poor a state that the cost of repairs was considered excessive. It is probable that the road was in fact only an unmade track at that time.

A request was made by the Fingal Council in December, 1948, for the road to be extended to provide a connection between Falmouth and Chain of Lagoons. The District Engineer, J.E. made a report and estimated the cost at 35,000 pounds but the request was refused due to the need for more urgent works elsewhere.

The Four Mile Creek Road is next mentioned when five men set up a fishing venture at Four Mile Creek in 1951 and wished to transport their catch to Bicheno. At that stage minor funds were provided for minimal maintenance of the road between Four Mile Creek and Falmouth.

The first subdivision at Four Mile Creek took place in 1958 and the Four Mile Creek Road was improved in 1962-63 by expenditure of \$2,500 with a similar amount in 1963-64.

Further requests for a link road in 1966 resulted in estimates of \$125,000 for an unsealed 5m pavement and \$394,000 for a sealed road of highway standard.

Construction of the road between Four Mile Creek and the Cray-Drop-In took place between 1970 and 1973.

A proposal to construct a road between Falmouth and Chain of Lagoons for log carting to Triabunna was first mentioned in September, 1973.

A petition advocating construction of the road link was submitted in July, 1974 following the closure of St. Marys pass for 7 weeks in April and May, due to a landslide.

Further requests were made for the link in 1982 to overcome the problems experienced by large vehicles, including longer buses, negotiating the Passes at that time.

Apart from the substantive submissions mentioned, a large number of letters have been received from organisations and individuals over the years requesting the provision of a link between Falmouth and Chain of Lagoons.

A considerable amount of investigation took place in 1973 with regard to the provision of a logging road but the eventual decision was to construct the alternative road for this purpose between St. Marys and Upper Scamander. This project was considered by the Parliamentary Standing Committee on Public Works.

The Committee saw that the need for a coastal road had been well established, but that there was considerable concern that the development of the road should not adversely effect the local area.

The Committee accepted the concern shown by the ratepayers of Four Mile Creek that their settlement should not lose its peaceful qualities. The Committee was also very concerned over the safety aspects that were mentioned by many of the witnesses.

The Committee was convinced by the strong and united reaction of the people of Four Mile Creek that the town should be bypassed at an early stage in the road construction to avoid the problems that would result from increased through traffic separating the settlement from the beach-front areas.

The Committee is of the opinion that the township of Four Mile Creek should be bypassed completely by any new road works. Proposed Route A does divide the township and is not recommended. After consideration of all the evidence received, the Committee recommends that Route C be adopted. This would result in a higher standard of road safety because it does not divide the community and it would allow for further development without disturbing the tranquil charm presently enjoyed.

- If double cylinder deadbolts on all exterior doors and if locked when you leave home.

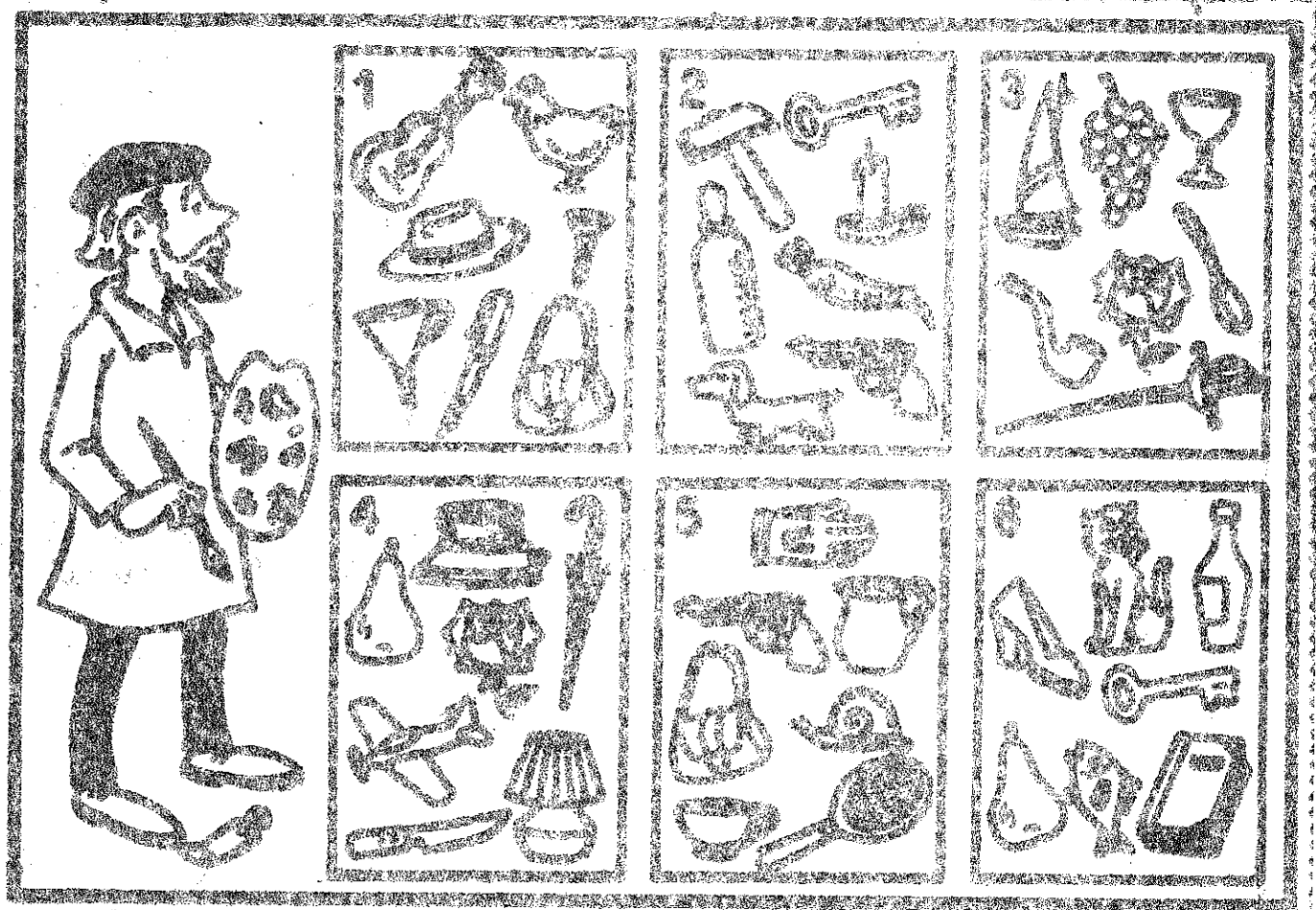
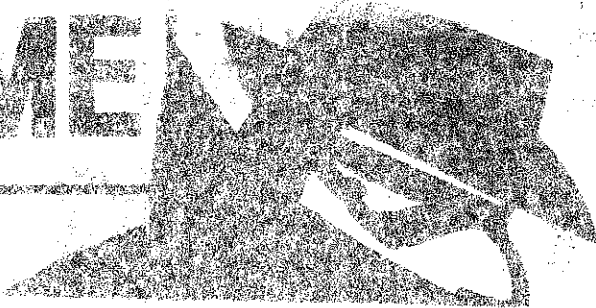
TOBACCO CAN TRICK
