Tasmania Little Athletics has over 300 members - children aged between 5 yrs - 12 yrs, involving 13 branches in various areas of the state.

These centres/clubs are run by the parents/guardians of the children, thus making it an enjoyable family event held most weekends, Oct - March.

Some children (a minority) have been found to have a certain athletic talent and through L.A.'s have been given the opportunity of competing at a national level (L.A.'s is an Australia wide organisation.)

The majority of children however, are participating in Tas L.A's for the sheer enjoyment of Family Fun and Fitness.

The main aim of the club is to encourage the child to have fun exercising in a mildly competitive way. Various goals are set which the child has the option to attain without pressure.

We are living in an age where heart disease and obesity are a very real threat to the survival of our children in adulthood. DO WE CARE? WHAT CAN WE DO to help our children avoid the probability of these diseases affecting the quality of their future lives?

We can guide them through the education of correct nutritional habits and encourage a healthy acceptance of regular exercise. It is feasible to presume that habits which we form as children have a great influence on our adaptations in adulthood.

How old are your children? Is one or more between the ages of 5yrs - 12 yrs? DO you enjoy assisting your child to explore new fields? Can you do more to promote a bond between you, your partner and your child/children?

Yes, it can be quite a hassle getting up and out on a Saturday morning but our children are not with us for many years. Yes, we are all

busy- probably you are more so than most, but your time will be your own in just a few short years.

Believe it or not, the parents can enjoy L.A's as much as the children if they are prepared to put a little effort into helping to run the Sat. morning meetings.

To operate a meeting each Sat, am, requires a minimum of 20 parents/guardians. At present St. Marys has 65 registered athletes.

The activities involved are :

(1) Field events - Discus, Shot, Javelin, High-long-triple jump,

(2) Track - 60m hurdles, 70m-100m-200m-400m-800m-1500m.

These are all covered over a 3 week roster- some restrictions according to ages.

We are governed by rules and regulations as stated by the State Executive committee of the Tasmania Little Athletics Association.

Please give some thought to joining in the fun of L.A's on Sat 6th Oct. Let's encourage our children to explore a new avenue of family fun.
