THE FINGAL HISTORICAL SOCIETY.

The Fingal Historical Society, which was formed in 1983 has outlined some points of interest.

We have on record:

Births in the Fingal Valley from 1839 - 1986

Marriages from 1839 - 1986

Deaths from 1867 - 1986

These are collected on a monthly basis from the Archives Section of the Launceston Library.

Here is some other information on just what our society has achieved to date.

Our society has been researching and collecting the documentary and photographic history of the Fingal Municipality since we established ourselves in 1983.

Our work has been voluntary, with the exception of several small donations from individuals and groups.

We have supported our activities by sales of copies of old photos, 2 publications, design and production of printed stationary and envelopes, design and production of local Christmas cards and other normal fundraising methods.

We have at this stage, copied and catalogued all readily available photographs, documents and records.

We continue to come across some new sources of information but these are mostly referred on to us by contacts already made.

We have also taped and recorded the verbal memories of some of the Valley's older residents, recorded headstone inscriptions of most of the cemeteries in the Valley, and maintained a daily surveillance of newspapers, magazines etc. in order to record today's history.

We have reproduced many photos for sale, and published two booklets - "D. Hayes-Memories of Gipps Creek" and "Do you Remember When?" Both of which were well received and sold very nicely. As time and funds permit, we will be doing further work in this field.

We have also had enlarged, framed and donated, old photographs of existing buildings for exhibition in the Fingal Hotel, Tasmanian Hotel Post Office and Council Chambers.

We have produced exhibition for The Tasmanian Hotel, Avoca Sesquicentenary, Fingal School Centenary, St. Marys Library opening, Cornwall Coal Co. Centenary, and many other smaller events. We believe it is important to take the exhibitions to other centres, rather than have everything in the one place. With this in mind we have travelled to Avoca, St. Marys and Mathinna.

Westpac Banking Corporation have been extremely helpful by allowing us to maintain a display at St. Marys.

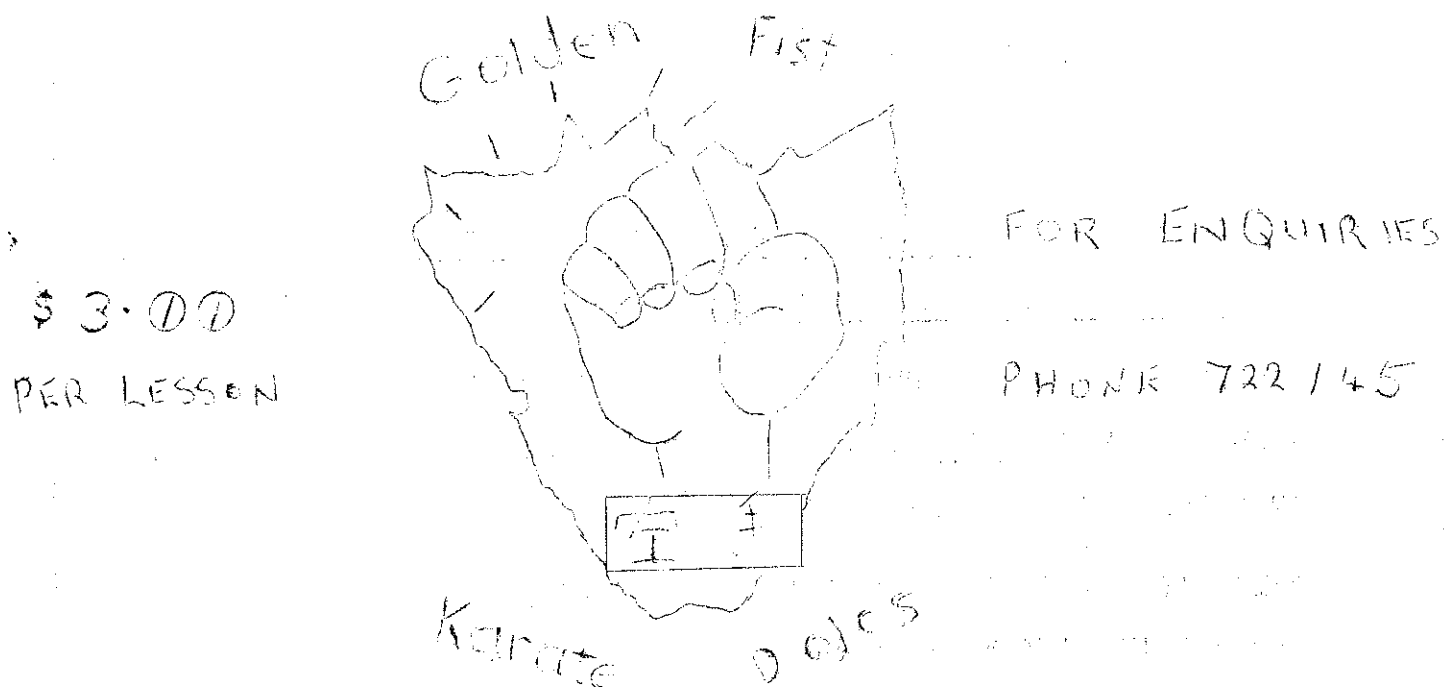

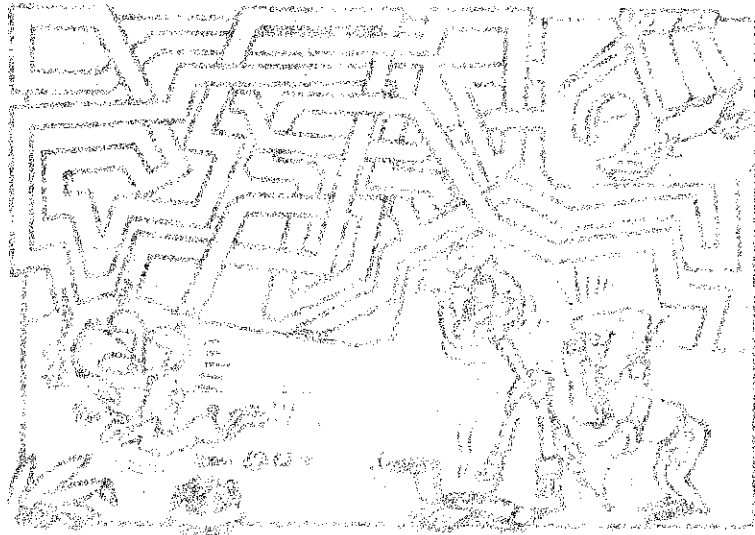

DEFENSIVE DRIVING.

Defensive driving requires a driver:

- * To consider each feature of a road hazard in sequence as the hazard is approached. A hazard is any circumstance which could cause a driver to change speed or direction.
- * To recognise that other drivers may not drive in strict conformity with the law, and be prepared to take evasive action.
- * To allow other drivers the time and space in which to correct driving errors and avoid the possibility of a collision.
- * To watch when driving for tell-tale clues which indicate traffic and pedestrian actions capable of producing a traffic hazard.
- * To practice a system of car control and inspection which minimises the possibility of becoming involved in a collision.
