PARENTS

CHILDREN NEED YOUR PROTECTION:

Know the length of time it takes your child to get home from school, immediately check any delayed arrival home.

Know the safest route to and from school and instruct your child to follow that route.

Visit the schools and become acquainted with teachers. You may learn of problem behaviour before it becomes serious.

If your child is to arrive home after dark arrange to meet him or her.

Know your childrens playmates and where they congregate.

Be sure any baby sitter you use is a responsible person, capable of acting in any emergency.

THE FRIENDLY STRANGER :

Inform your child that strangers come in all shapes and sizes.

Instruct them to report to you any suspicious person, or attempts to approach them by unknown adults.

Warn your child to ignore requests from strangers for assistance.

Do not allow children to accept rides or gifts from strangers, even ones who tell them that they are friends of the family.

Train your child to check with you before going anywhere with anyone, and that they should report any suspicious actions of adults or other children in the vicinity of schools or playing areas.

Make sure that you take the time to check on all these things, do not leave it to the child and hope that he or she will do it automatically.

At home, in the street or anywhere BE ALERT to anything suspicious.

A MESSAGE TO WOMEN FOR PROTECTION:

For your protection in the home, check door locks, make sure the lock is adequate and firmly fixed.

Install a door viewer or peep hole in the front door. This will enable you to identify the caller with out opening the door.

Install a safety chain on the door - and use it.

Avoid making it obvious a female lives alone.

If a door or window has been forced in your absence, ring the police and await their arrival.

Request identification from any service or repairmen before you allow them to enter the premises. Never admit to any callers that you are alone.

Make sure blinds or curtains are drawn before you undress.

Do not leave keys hidden outside, the wrong person often finds them.

Respond to your neighbour's need as you have her respond to yours.

BEFORE GOING OUT AT NIGHT:

Make sure you lock up before leaving home. Carry identification, also phone numbers you may need. Leave word with someone to indicate destination and time of return. Determine routes of travel. Estimate time enroute, and at places to be visited.

If travelling by public transport, board vehicles from well light areas. Remain there until transport arrives. Choose location with most passengers. Observe passengers, change seats if uneasy about their behaviour.

FARM KILLED MEAT IN BUTCHER SHOPS TO BE DISCONTINUED

Since the introduction of the Meat Hygiene Act (1985) in July 1986, Inspectors from the Department of Agriculture have issued permits to allow farmers to take carcasses or parts of carcasses, from animals killed on their farm, to butcher shops for cutting up or processing.

However, due to some abuse of this system, the difficulty in monitoring meat movement and the fact that the permits system was not really designed for such meat movement, it has been decided to discontinue issuing such permits.

From 1 February 1988 it will be required that all meat in butcher shops must only come from animals slaughtered at a licensed abattoir or slaughterhouse.

Therefore, as from that date, no more permits will be issued by the Department for the transfer of farm killed meat to butcher shops.
