PROTECTING YOUR HOME WHEN ABSENT.

Should you vacate your home over holiday periods, the following points should be considered.

Trim back your shrubbery as often an overgrown garden will give cover to anyone considering burglaring your home. Less coverage gives more

exposure to the public.

Advise your neighbour and have him park his car in your driveway and collect your mail, both junk and normal. Leave key with him so he can go inside and change window drapes periodically.

Consider the purchase of a cheap timer to turn on a reading lamp or radio, or both, inside the house. This will indicate that someone is

Turn down your bell/ringer on your phone so that it cannot be heard outside the house. Constant ringing of the phone is a sign that no one is home and may encourage an impromptu burglary.

Don't leave a note out for the milkman, baker etc., as burglars can

also read.

Cancel milk, papers, bread etc., a few days before you leave. will enable you to check that they are not still being delivered prior to your departure.

Advise your local police station who may be able to assist with passing attention during their

patrols.

IS YOUR DOG OR CAT ACTING STRANGELY?

There have been at least three pets treated in St. Helens lately

for snake bite.

Luckily their owners presented them at the Vets in time to be saved. It is desirable all pet owners are aware of the signs most pets show once bitten by a snake.

The earliest sign of snake bite vomiting. The animal will have is vomiting.

difficulty breathing.
Unlike in movies the fangs of Tasmanian snakes are very small and usually leave no noticable wound. If you see your pet playing with a snake or showing the above signs - take it to your Vet immediately, as snake bite can kill within 30 minutes.

The exact time it takes can varyit depends on the snake, where your pet was bitten, how many times it was bitten, how much venom was injected and how long it is before

treatment is started.

There is no need to endanger yourself by trying to identify or capture the snake. In Tasmania, all snakes are poisonous but, luckily, all respond to the same treatment and antivenom.

LETTER TO THE EDITOR

Dear Sir, Is it really any wonder flights from Tasmania are not fully booked? Slowly but surely it seems, Tasmanians are being cut off from the rest of Australia.

Not only has the cost of airfares risen out of all proportion with Tasmanian wages, but we now see actual services being cut back.

In December 1983, a return economy ticket Launceston to Melbourne cost \$190.80. In July last year, the same ticket cost \$284.00 - an increase of 48.8%. By comparison; the CPI increase from December 1983 to June 1988 was 35%.

At the same time, services to the mainland have been steadily declining. In February 1983 TAA withdrew from Devonport Airport. August 1987 saw the takeover by Ansett of East West, who withdrew from the Burnie-Wynyard Airport in February 1988. Australian Airlines closed their Devonport and Burnie offices and Ansett-Air N.S.W. scrapped their daily air service between Hobart Devonport and Sydney. Now Ansett is to withdraw from Devonport and

have downgraded some Melbourne-Launceston flights by replacing jets with Fokker-50's.

It's bad enough that many Tasmanians cannot afford to fly to the main-land anymore, but now they have to put up with fewer services and smaller planes!
