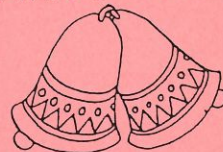

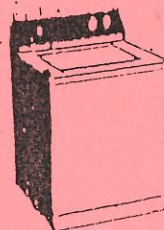

Remember if you drink, don't drive. St. Marys and surrounding towns are only small and it is not far to walk should you go to your local hotel for a drink.

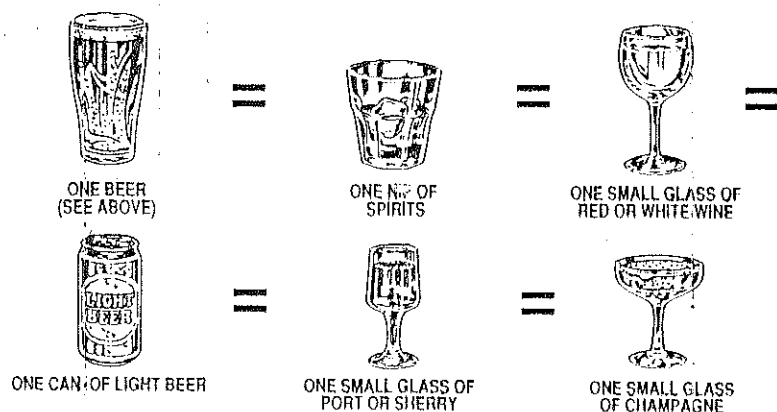

WHAT COUNTS AS ONE DRINK?

When we refer to one drink we mean a standard drink containing between 8-10 grams of alcohol. For example a **medium glass of full strength beer** - a middy in NSW, ACT or WA, a pot in VIC, QLD or TAS, a schooner in SA and a handle in NT - counts as one drink. A **large glass of light beer** - a schooner in NSW, ACT, WA and NT and a pint in SA - is also a standard drink, as are the following measures.



The following contain more than one standard drink:

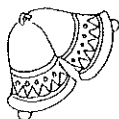
1 can of full strength beer = 1 + 1/2 drinks. A six pack of full strength stubbies = 9 drinks. A six pack of light stubbles = 5 drinks. 1 bottle of red or white wine = 7 drinks.

Never drink boutique or imported beers or cocktails if you are driving, as their alcohol content can vary and be very high.

Zero BAC laws apply in Australia to learners, novices, (first three years of driving up to 25 years old), probationers and heavy truck, bus, or professional drivers. **Do not drink at all if you are driving.** Contact your local traffic authority for full details.
