HOME SECURITY

The cost of security measures can range from a few hundred dollars for putting deadbolts on external doors and keyed locks on windows to more than \$40 000 for a comprehensive package.

When allocating money for improving security, remember the old saying: You only get what you pay for.

Security precautions can be categorised into five groups:

- * Making the property unappealing to the potential intruder.
- * Making entry to your home as difficult as possible.
- * Assuming entry has taken place, fitting alarm detector systems.
- * Regular patrolling of your property by a security firm while you're absent.
- * Installation of a solidly made safe to hold valuables.

The first two are the best frontline defences because it's better to keep intruders out rather than to have to deal with them once they're in.

However, you don't want to live in a fortress - the burglary risk in your area should be the guiding factor.

When it comes to discouraging burglars, there are several points worth considering:

- * Keep a dog, the sort that is more likely to bite the hand of a potential burglar than lick it.
- * Clear away thin trees and shrubs that provide thick cover around vulnerable windows and doors.

* Install strong flood-lighting around the house. This can work on a timing switch or a heat-sensing system that automatically turns on if someone ventures on to your property.

Nearly 70 per cent of break-ins occur during daylight hours, but you can deter the other 30 per cent.

* Install a Neighbourhood Watch notice. The scheme was initially successful in reducing burglaries, although it appears to be foundering in some areas because of apathy. Perhaps you could revive it in your street.

* Leave lights on and radios playing if you go out. If you have a series of time switches, you can create the impression that the house is full of people.

* Replace low or easily-climbed fences with higher ones and consider putting in a lockable steel entry gate which can only be opened electronically.

* Lock away any ladders, chairs and similar appliances which could help an intruder reach a high window or the roof.

Once on the roof, it is a simple matter for the burglar to lift a few tiles and gain entry to the house through the man-hole.

Cost of tape and booklet \$10.00.

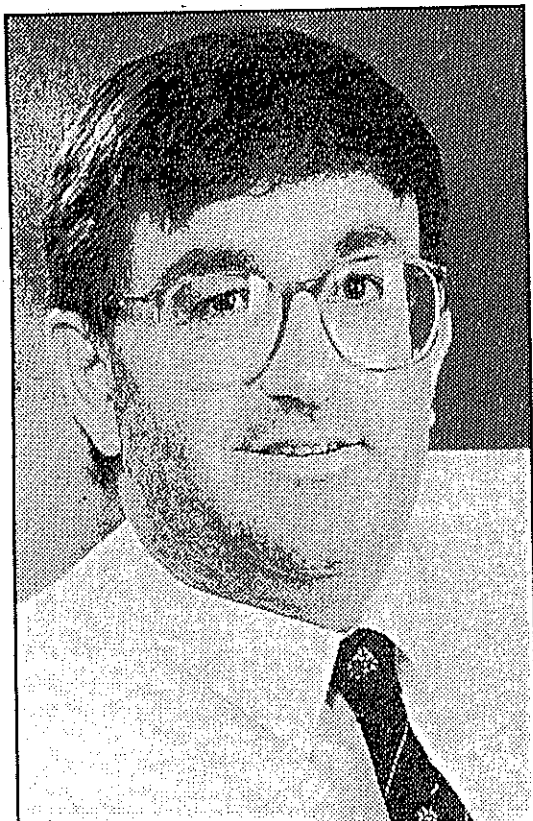
Tapes can still be purchased through Chris at the Kinder and members of the Swimming Pool Committee.

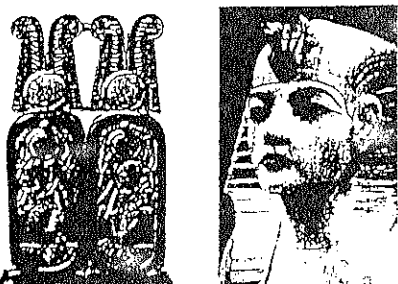

FIREWOOD

With the days becoming shorter and the nights cooler, the time has once again come to think about the winter's firewood supply.

Firewood is a major product of our forests, with around a million tonnes being harvested in the state each year for domestic and commercial use. With this in mind, the Forestry Commission has recently reviewed its policy regarding the supply of firewood to the public in order to make it more consistent statewide.

As a result, some new guide-lines and pricing arrangements have been put into place for both commercial cutters and the general public, with the aim of minimising the environmental impact of firewood gathering, whilst simplifying its management and control.

For the domestic user, the main aspects of the policy are:

- * The Forestry Commission wishes to encourage collection of firewood during the summer months to help minimise environmental damage. Incentives have been put in place to help achieve this.
- * A new Wood Gatherers' Licence is available for a period of up to three months during the drier period from November to April at a cost of \$20. This licence authorises the removal of 15 m³ stacked (10 tonnes) of firewood. Only one of these licences will be issued per household per year.
- * Firewood will still be available during the winter months, but at a cost of \$3.00 per m³ stacked (\$4.00 per tonne).
- * The availability of free firewood has been significantly reduced. Generally it will only be available to charitable organisations or to people in necessitous circumstances due to genuine financial hardship.
- * Pensioners and other Social Security Card Holders are entitled to a half price discount on the cost of the Wood Gatherers' Licence. This means that the Licence will cost \$10 for 15 m³ stacked. There is no discount available on firewood gathered between May and October.

Anyone wishing to collect firewood on a commercial basis should contact the Forestry Commission Office at Fingal.

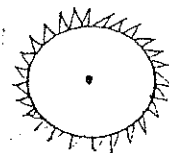

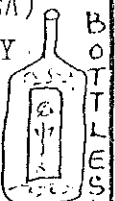

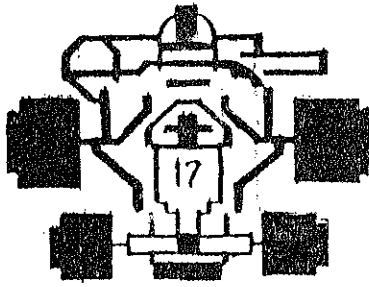
