THE LONDON-SYDNEY MARATHON

The start of the London-Sydney Marathon is less than a month away and our 'Tas-Works' 1968 XT GT Falcon is somewhere off the African Coast on route to Southampton England.

Even up until last week the route for the event was still being modified through several countries avoiding trouble spots which have necessitated an airlift of the entire event over Afganistan and detouring Yugoslavia altogether. In fact in November while event director, Nick Brittan was in the town of Erzincan in Turkey, a special stage control, he unfortunately witnessed the public execution of 19 people.

At present the route looks like this - London, cross the Channel to Calais in France, then to Ypres in Belgium, onto Igls in Austria including special stages up the European Hillclimb Championship Course. Another special stage near Vienna takes us through the private forest of a local Baron who in the evening is hosting all the competitors at a banquet in his castle. We continue on through Slovakia (ex Czechoslovakia) into Hungary and a day off in Budapest. Romania we drive through in one day, into Bulgaria then Turkey. All this means we skip Yugoslavia where originally we were to have gone. In fact our hotel in Sarajevo is now a pile of rubble.

Three days in Turkey, from West to East into Iran, we head along the old Marco Polo trade route, the fabled Silk Road, through the Kharakhum Desert in Uzbekistan to Samarkand and Tashkent in Soviet Union. There is the first of our two airlifts across to Delhi in India, avoiding Afganistan. In Jodhpur and Udiapur we stay in Maharajah's Palace's (200 bedrooms) before a couple of 900km days through millions and millions of people to Bombay. Imagine trying to close off a Special Stage Section in India which makes us think how lucky we are with Targa Tasmania. Another airlift then to Perth Western Australia and relative 'safety'.

The Australian leg is real Falcon - Monaro V8 country with 1000km gravel days the average. Seven days from Perth to Sydney via Esperance - Kalgoorlie - Eucla - Pt. Augusta - Broken Hill - Wangaratta - Canberra and finally to Sydney Opera House steps some 30 days after leaving London. The Presentation Black Tie Ball in Sydney beckons those that finish and finishing this event is the 'problem'. If we breakdown on route, we are out of the event and have to find our own way home, vehicle included. Even if we catch up in Bombay we will not be allowed to board the plane to Perth.

Some Interesting Facts

All cars must be pre-1969

No service crews, although we can obtain assistance from roadside garages. (Help Grant where are you when we need you?)

Only two drives/navigators per car and all spares etc. must be listed on the 'carnet' (effectively a passport for the vehicle)

If we blow a tyre for example, we must carry the casing to the border other wise we are charged duty.

If the car is stripped whilst we are relieving ourselves behind a date palm, we have to pay duty on the items stolen!

The entire event, 120 cars is to be airlifted by 2 Russian Antanov 124 planes, the largest in the world over the Himalayas and from Bombay to Perth.

PENSIONERS WITH SHARES COULD HAVE PENSIONS REDUCED

"Pensioners with shares could have their pensions reduced in September when the Government's new means test method as applied by the Department of Social Security comes into play," Senator Watson (Lib,Tas) said today whilst addressing several hundred independent retirees at the Albert Hall.

"From September, any retiree who has a part pension and owns shares will have any increases in the value of their shares assessed by the DSS as being increases in their income."

"Under the old rules only the share dividends were included as part of the income for means test purposes. Now even though the shareholder has not received any cash the increase in the value of the shares will be taken into account."

"The Department of Social Security Rules are in direct contrast to the Australian Taxation Office rules of what is income. Capital Gains are assessed at point of sale."

"With the current rebound in the share market showing recoveries of over 30 per cent or more in many leading share prices since December, it is expected that up to 86,000 aged pensioners will be affected." Senator Watson urged the meeting to lobby the Government to reverse this potentially devastating decision.

The carnival is conducted in senior and junior divisions and we finished 3rd in junior division and 1st in the senior division.

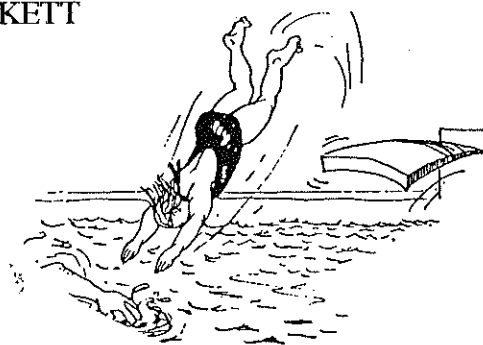

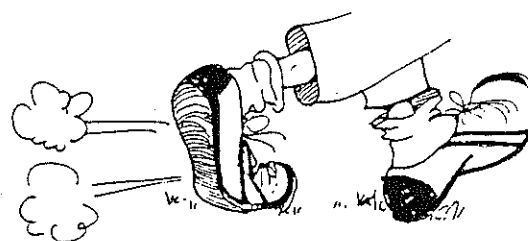

MARRIAGE GUIDANCE COUNSELLORS NEEDED

During the election campaign both parties supported the concept of the family as an institution. Hopefully, the new Government will be quick to implement this into financial benefits.

Last year, the Parliamentary Joint Select Committee into the Family Law Act released its report on the operation of the Family Law Act. This report noted specifically the difficulty being experienced by marriage counselling organisations in meeting the demand for appointments.

The report noted that, "sufficient funding be provided to approved marriage counselling organisations to enable the prompt provision of appointments to potential clients and to improve the accessibility of marriage counselling to those living in rural and remote areas."

With over one million Australian lives disrupted by divorce since the inception of the Family Law Act, it is imperative that this Government implement increased funding to marriage counselling organisations as recommended.

The costs of hiring extra marriage counsellors is far cheaper than the costs incurred in any divorce.

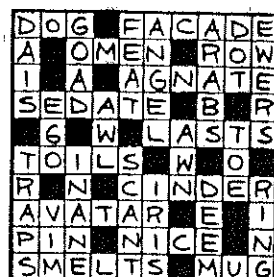

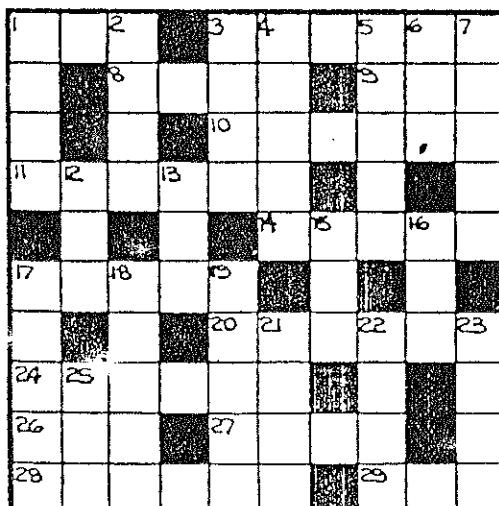
