SPEED AND SPEED LIMITS

Excessive speed is a frequent cause of serious accidents. Speed should never, under any circumstances, exceed safe limits. Where there are speed limits (including speed limits for certain types of vehicles and loads), observe them at all times. When driving conditions are unfavourable, reduce your speed so that you can stop in an emergency without skidding or losing control.

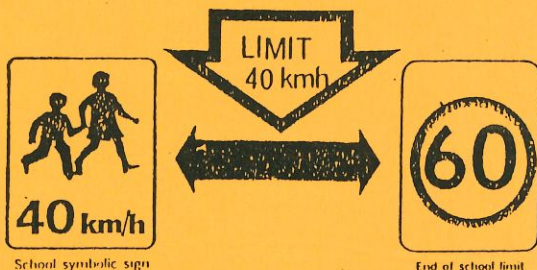
There is a speed limit of 60 km/h in any built-up area, for example in a city or town — unless a sign indicates a higher or lower limit on a particular street.

OUTSIDE CITIES OR TOWNS AN ABSOLUTE SPEED LIMIT OF 110 km/h APPLIES UNLESS A SIGN INDICATES A LOWER SPEED IN A PARTICULAR AREA. FOR PROVISIONAL LICENCE HOLDERS THE LIMIT IS 80 km/h.

Speed zones are marked by a sign at the start and a sign at the end.

A speed limit of 40 km/h applies in a school zone, the limits of which are defined by either a 'SCHOOL' sign and an 'END OF SCHOOL LIMIT' sign, or a symbolic sign. This limit is *prima facie*, which means that a driver who exceeds the limit is required to prove that the speed at which he drove was not dangerous or negligent having regard to all circumstances.

The speed limit when towing a trailer or caravan is 80 km/h.



Children's Crossings

'Children Crossing' means a section of carriageway defined by two parallel broken road markings, near which is displayed an orange sign or flag containing the words 'Children Crossing'.

A driver approaching a children's crossing shall do so at such a speed as to be able to stop if necessary.

When stopping, a vehicle must not pass over the STOP-LINE road marking on the approach to the crossing.

Speed and Stopping Distances

Following Too Closely.

Do not follow too closely to the vehicle in front. You need ample space in which to stop in case of an emergency.

Minimum safe distances for different speeds on flat dry roads are:

- ☐ 1 car length between vehicles at 15 km/h
- ☐ 2 car lengths between vehicles at 30 km/h
- ☐ 3 car lengths between vehicles at 45 km/h
- ☐ 4 car lengths between vehicles at 60 km/h
- ☐ 5 car lengths between vehicles at 75 km/h

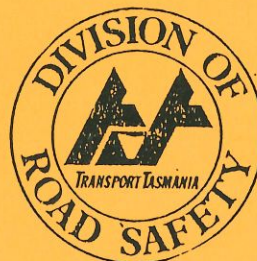
These distances should be increased if the road is wet.

Outside cities and towns the distance between trucks and buses should be no less than 60 metres, except when overtaking.

ATTRIBUTES OF A GOOD DRIVER

A good driver is one:

- ☐ who knows his own limitations and capabilities and drives within them;
- ☐ who knows the probable limitations and capabilities of other road users and respects them;
- ☐ who knows the capabilities and limitations of the vehicle he is driving and does not exceed them;
- ☐ whose mental approach to driving is to maintain an accident free record;
- ☐ who possesses a sound knowledge of traffic laws, road-craft and nature's laws — and puts that knowledge to good use;
- ☐ who exercises courtesy and consideration for others.

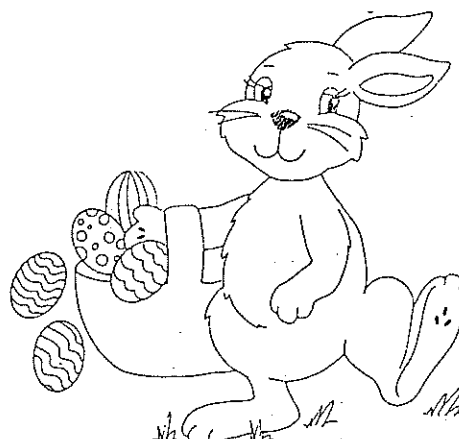


CRESSY SPORTS EXCHANGE

POLICE REPORT

BUS STOP

I have noticed during the time that I have been at St. Marys, that we have a few motorist in the area, who have no consideration for the Redline Coach buses.

I ask that motorists read the parking signs situated outside Scotts Newsagency and adhere, to the times stated on the signs and give the Redline Coach or any other bus wishing to use the stop during the nominated times a fair go. Should motorist insist on using it and causing the bus any inconvenience, they can expect to be prosecuted.

ROAD MARKINGS

Over the past month or so the police have received several complaints in regards to the way motorists are driving up and down the St. Marys Pass.

As you all know, St. Marys Pass is a narrow winding road, and if not used correctly, can be dangerous.

Complaints received are mainly to the fact that drivers are continually crossing over double white lines and driving too fast for road conditions.

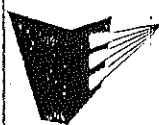

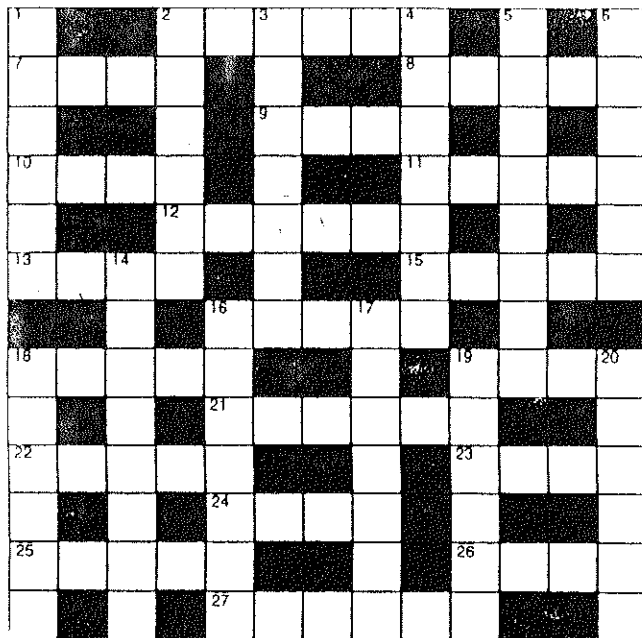

- 1 MEDIUM ZUCCHINI
 2 CHICKEN CUBES
 2 TABLESPOONS BUTTER
 1 CUP WATER
 CHOPPED ONION
 3/4 CUP CREAM
 1 TEASPOON LEMON JUICE
 1 TEASPOON CURRY POWDER

PEEL AND CHOP ZUCCHINI. COOK

GRATE UNPEELED ZUCCHINI COARSELY.

 CHEESE, SIFTED FLOUR, OIL AND LIGHTLY
 BEATEN EGGS, AND SEASON TO TASTE.
 POUR INTO WELL GREASED LAMINGTON TIN
 (16X 26CM). BAKE IN MODERATE OVEN
 30-40 MINS, OR UNTIL BROWNED.

AMUSE THE CHILDREN

PAINT

Flour and Water Finger Paint: Children love to
 finger paint and now and then it's really worth the
 mess (and it *will* be a mess). Mix flour and salt
 with a little water to make a paste the consistency
 of thick gravy. Sprinkle in a little food coloring.
 Cover the children's clothes with aprons or old
 shirts and let them paint with their hands directly
 on the kitchen table. Put spoonfuls of the paint
 on the table, and let them slide their hands in it.
 As they work, sprinkle in a little more food color-
 ing to change the color. If you want to save a pic-
 ture, press shelf paper over the tabletop art work
 and the paint will stick to it. Have a sponge handy
 to mop up. You can let them finger paint on the
 kitchen linoleum floor. Food coloring won't stain
 and you can mop it right off.

Shaving-Soap Finger Paint: Buy a can of shaving
 soap (non-mentholated) and let him use it on the
 kitchen table. The smooth texture will delight your
 child. Some colored powder paint sprinkled here and
 there will sustain his interest. When soap begins
 to dry, a few drops of water or more soap can
 be added. Here the process is more important than
 the product. When finished, the soap wipes off
 easily with a dry towel and is less messy to clean up
 than finger paint. This is good for two-year-olds, too

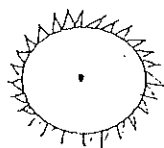
