CHILD SEXUAL ABUSE IS A CRIME

THE FACTS

- Many children experience some form of sexual abuse.
- In the majority of cases the offender is someone known to the child.
- Child sexual abuse occurs in all kinds of families.
- Boys and girls of all ages may be sexually abused.

WHY IS PREVENTION IMPORTANT?

Parents can not always be available to protect their children 24 hours a day. Also, children are often misinformed about when and where sexual abuse might occur and who might abuse them. It is important that children have accurate information and are taught skills to keep themselves safe.

WHAT ARE PERSONAL SAFETY PROGRAMMES?

Children are taught rules about traffic, fire, water and safety, from an early age. Personal safety programmes are designed to help children learn the rules for keeping themselves safe.

The most widely used programme in kindergartens and schools is the PROTECTIVE BEHAVIOURS PROGRAMME. Ask about this program at your child's school or kindergarten.

WHAT DO CHILDREN NEED TO KNOW?

To help children protect themselves from sexual abuse they need to know and understand the principles of personal safety. Most people find it difficult to talk to children especially young children about how to protect themselves from child sexual abuse. Some ideas:

- include the topic in a discussion about general safety-water, roads.
- when talking to children about sexual safety, use the correct names of the parts of the body, this teaches children to be comfortable with their body.

Topics to be covered include the micro-skills associated with professional interviewing, relaxation, conflict management, assertion and stress management. As adults learn when motivated, and relaxed, an experiential approach will guide the activities which range from discussion and written exercises to role plays. No certificate will be given at the conclusion of the programme and it should not be regarded as a professional qualification. However, it is expected that all will enjoy this form of learning and that participants will feel better equipped to handle the sometimes delicate situation that most of us find ourselves in from time to time.

All participants will be offered the opportunity to watch themselves as interviewers on video in order to learn more about their personal style of interacting. For maximum benefit to group-members, numbers will be limited, so please take this opportunity to learn more about yourself and to stretch your talents.
