BREAK O'DAY COUNCIL STRATEGIC PLAN

The Break O'Day Council has released the first draft of its Strategic Plan for comment by the community. The purpose of the Plan is to clearly state what the Council and the community want to achieve for the Municipality, the issues and problems to be addressed and how this will be done. The Plan sets out a vision for the future together with objectives for the next five years and strategies and programmes to achieve them.

The issues facing the Break O'Day Municipality have been identified after extensive consultations with Councillors, council staff, State and Commonwealth agencies and community groups, as well as through the community meetings that were held.

The Strategic Plan covers a five year period and will be reviewed and updated annually to reflect performance and changing directions. The Plan forms an integral part of Council's management approach and forms a basis for the Annual Report and all financial reports.

The Plan details the Strategic Programmes that Council has identified as being central to its operations together with new programmes it will be pursuing and these programmes include:-

- Employment and Economic Development
- Coastal, Maritime and Catchment Management
- Community Partnership and Profile
- Transport and Communications
- Water and Water Reuse
- Waste Management
- Community Facilities and Property
- Community Development

Submissions from the community on the plan have been invited and must be received by the 16 May 1994. Copies are available from the Fingal and St Helens offices free of charge.

The Council would like as much response as possible from the community, either in support of the plan or as constructive criticism.

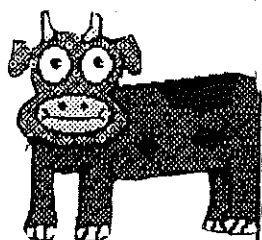

PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

At the last Parents and Friends meeting a couple of issues were raised which the executive acted upon and have been successful in gaining action.

The condition of St. Marys Pass since the rainfall last December was of great concern as many students travel by bus over this road daily. A letter was sent to the office of the Transport Minister who has given the following undertaking in writing.

- The post and wire fence adjacent to the large dip area where para webbing is currently erected will be reinstated before Easter.
- The pavement deformation adjacent to the slip area will be repaired with asphalt prior to Easter.
- The existing temporary wire mesh erected to retain rock debris sliding down batter face will be inspected and made secure.
- Repair of slip areas will commence the week after Easter.

The second concern raised was the overcrowded situation on the Scamander and Falmouth buses. We have received a written undertaking that an additional bus will be used to relieve this situation after Easter.

These two cases I believe are a measure of the success of parental pressure on government agencies and I would like to thank and congratulate Parents and Friends on their action and consequent results. I would also urge as many parents as possible to support our Parents and Friends.
