Extract from A DRAFT CODE ON FISHING FOR THE FUTURE

WHAT IS IT ALL ABOUT?

World wide more and more laws are being developed to protect fewer fish and their dwindling habitat why? Because there is growing recognition that without action the marine resource as we know it now will not be there for future generations.

REGULATIONS AND THE CODE

The code on fishing for the future is not law it is an agreement among fishers on

at are acceptable fishing practices. You will see that part of the code is to abide by fisheries regulations designed to protect the resource.

Laws and regulations are mandatory for all Tasmanians. They are being refined and developed now under management plans for all Tasmanian fisheries. There are choices to be made on what should be in regulations and what should be in the guide.

Some bag limits now in the code including shark, yellowfin tuna, southern bluefin tuna and bream are likely to be included in regulations. Some people think we should include more. What do you think?

NET FISHING

- * know and observe netting regulations which state where fishing is allowed, and the number, type and length of nets which can be used.
- * know how and when to use nets to target particular species and reduce the take of non-target species.
- * know how to use nets so that unwanted fish can be released with the best chance of survival.
- * use only enough nets to meet immediate needs.
- * use quality nets which are properly weighted.
- * mark nets appropriately for easy identification and retrieval.
- * set nets in the right place, avoiding strong currents and tidal

- flows that can lead to net loss and ghost fishing.
- * do not set nets across navigation channels.
- * leave at least 50 metres between nets.
- * do not set nets within 50 metres of divers.
- * attend nets so they can be pulled quickly if the weather looks like breaking up. thus avoiding loss or damage to the net and catch.
- * pull nets at least every 2-3 hours where possible.
- * avoid setting nets overnight where possible.
- * only set mullet nets over sandy bottom in order to catch mullet and mackerel.
- * do not target crayfish with nets.

ROD AND LINE FISHING

- * know and use the right hooks and rigs to target specific species.
- * attend rods and lines and use no more than two rods or hand lines per fisher.
- * secure hooks and lures properly to avoid loss of tackle and catch.
- * use no more than 5 hooks per line.
- * take only enough bait for our fishing needs and try alternatives, including lures.
- * use appropriate footwear when rock fishing, never fishing alone at dangerous fishing spots.
- * use appropriate gear to dispatch fish quickly and know how to


- remove hooks and avoid damaging fish.
- * retrieve broken and snagged lines where possible.
- * consider joining a fishing club to learn more about correct fishing methods.

CRAYFISHING

- * know and understand the regulations relating to crayfish, particularly those concerning undersized or soft shelled fish, and berried females.
- * know and observe the specified bag and possession limits.
- * know how to bait pots properly.
- * recognise that fish heads and fish frames are good bait and their use can avoid wasting valuable scale fish
- * pull pots at least daily to avoid needless waste and to lessen the chance of the theft of catch and
- * release surplus or forbidden crayfish carefully and as soon as possible in the area from which they were taken and not over sandy bottom.
- * do not target crayfish with nets.

SAFETY PRACTICES

- * understand the risks of excess alcohol when boating.
- * watch the weather and check the forecase on 11541 before setting off. Fish in safe and sheltered spots.
- * know and comply with the minimum safety eequipment requirements.
- * install radio equipment in sea going boats.
- * carry safety equipment including flares to help identify our location if we get into diffuculty.
- * learn swimming, safety and survival skills, it could save a life.
- * use life jackets, preferably ones which offer thermal, protection.
- * consider doing appropriate courses to improve our knowledge of boat handling and water safety.



LETTERS TO THE EDITOR

Dear Sir.

The recent decision to increase interest rates will not affect low-income home buyers with lower deposits, but will also hit small business including indebted farmers.

Had the Keating government adopted a more appropriate fiscal policy in it's May Budget to bear its fair share of minimising the debt, the impact of the rise would have been lessened. Instead it's fiscal policies have been too loose and the Government opted for the easy option of a "do nothing" budget.

Business is still recovering from the recession "we had to have" and has been restructuring it's balance sheets. Small business reliance on overdrafts will see it being penalised again through increased cost of borrowing flowing from the interest rate rise.

The recovery in business investment, a cornerstone of the May budget could be jeopardised by the interest rate hike. The spectre of wage increases in now a possibility.

While financial markets have welcomed the interest rate increase, small business and low-income home buyers are overlooked by the Government yet again. It is time the Government paid attention to their needs and adapted policies to stimulate small business on a continuing basis and help the average Australian.

BREAK-O-DAY COUNCIL

WATER RESTRICTIONS ST.MARYS AND SCAMANDER

Owing to the extraordinary dry period currently being experienced, it has become necessary to impose water restrictions at both St Marys and Scamander.

At St Marys, this month (September) has been the driest since 1894 with only 1.6mm (6 points) of rain falling to date and the rainfall for the year has been only 48% of the average.

Scamander is experiencing similar problems with lack of rainfall and the river level fell to below the pump intake level last Sunday.

To minimise the usage of water, the following restrictions apply to both areas:

OTAL BAN ON FIXED HOSES AND SPRINKLERS

This means that hand held hoses only may be used for watering of gardens. The current penalty, for failure to comply, is \$160.00 and \$40.00 per day thereafter.

Under By-Law Number 43, Council may prohibit the use of water for gardening if supply becomes threatened. This would obviously be a last resort, and Council urges consumers to restrict the use of water as described above.

CORNWALL - The way it was continued.....

In the 1930"s Cornwall was a very multicultured community. We had the beautiful dialect of the Scottish families, a few Irish and of course the broad tongue of the Yorkshire people, all mixed in with our Australian tongue. After a while it was very easy to listen and understand them.

A few months before I came to Cornwall there was trouble at the mine and police had to be called in to keep the peace. Scab labour had been used to undermine the miners claim for better wages. Times were relatively quiet for a few years until a big strike of 6 months in 1937.

As at that time most meetings were held on the "flat" and most of the men were forceful men, everybody knew what was happening. During this time nobody went without. There was no dole, but a man and wife received 1.00 (1 pound) a fortnight, rabbits were plentiful and the bush had wallabies and kangaroos and you could sell the skins, also as there were no deep freezers the fishermen always passed on their surplus catches. This strike unfortunately wasn't the only strike in 2 years we had at least 18 months strike.

Cornwall was a great family orientated place. We had the Maddens, the Haas, whether spelt Haas, Hayes or Hays,

the Margisons, the Parsons, the Fords, the Toombs and the Targetts and Nolans to name a few. In some cases related to one another, but all willing to support the town.

The women in their own way were very strong. They helped the men in everything they did even though they had their homes and their families to look after.

Often when relations came to Cornwall they are usually sent to me to find out about different happenings or where certain things are. Some of these happenings are - what happened to the pine trees. Of course we know that these were cut down because they were supposed to be dangerous - also what happened to the pine tree planted to commemorate the Battle of Waterloo. There is nothing to show why they were planted in the first place, also there is the German Machine Gun, lent to the R.S.L. where has it gone?

This gun was brought back from World War 1 by Jack Margison and Alec Parsons. It was lent to the Deloraine War Museum, who repaired it and returned it to Cornwall. It was then put in trust to the R.S.L. and was on the wall in the Institute.

Since this hall was sold, I do not know where it has gone but I think it should be returned to Cornwal.

One thing which always stood out when the mine was active and the managers and office was at Cornwall, the Manager, his wife and his family were a part of Cornwall they were always there to help.

Like any other coal mine we have had our tragedy, men getting killed, some collapsing of heart failure (Mr Hood, a Manager, one of these), others crushed by the skips, and of course when a young visitor was run over by a train at the screens.

Over the years, our young have played their part, whether in sport, scholastically in war, in local government.


Cornwall can really be proud of the impact they have made in the betterment of people lives.
