#### INFECTIONS FROM ANIMALS TO PEOPLE

I'm often asked about the incidence of zoonotic diseases in this State. How many Tasmanian children contract ringworm from companion animals? What is the prevalence of toxoplasmosis? Have any Tasmanians ever been infested with liver fluke?

The answer to all such queries has to be, 'nobody knows".

Why? Because, although nearly all zoonoses are notifiable diseases, accurate diagnosis of them depends on awareness of their existence.

In this regard it could be stated, 'surely that is your job; to make the general public aware of the incidence of zoonotic diseases and advise how they might be combated.

True enough; but it's sometimes easier said than done. With hydatids it was fairly simple. Then we had a killer disease which was easy to publicise due to the obvious benefits accruing from its control.

Increased public awareness, especially consequent upon a concerted education campaign in schools, resulted in the virtual eradication of hydatid disease in Tasmania.

Apart from Leptospirosis, which has fairly low prevalence in this State, there's not, nor ever has been, a zoonosis as serious as hydatids. Its elimination has therefore tended to make owners somewhat complacent about animal-human contacts, and the risks entailed therefrom when basic hygiene is ignored.

Consquently, while hydatids might have disappeared other zoonoses definitely have not. If anything their incidence is rising.

A major difficulty with monitoring them is they tend to come and go depending on conditions and circumstances.

For example, in the last couple of years, in some northern dairying districts, enteric salmonellosis has been springing up almost from nowhere, then disappearing. While we know calves are the frequent source of human infection we're not sure from whence the organisms originate. Victoria is experiencing the same problem.

Without spending a lot of time and money, which we don't have anyway, it's difficult to track down the epidemiology of intermittent enteric infections.

A further complication is the constant emergence of new organisms. For instance the very unpleasant Salmonella abortus ovis was thought not to exist in Australia but last June was diagnosed in two New South Wales children - the first recorded human infection with this organism anywhere in the world.

Since this bacterium has its origin in sheep and there are plenty of them around it is quite likely the zoonosis is more widespread than we think. Again it becomes a matter of awareness and monitoring.


The ink was barely dry on that notification when we received advice about another 'first time in Australia' zoonosis report.

This time it was a canine bacterium called Gastrospirillum hominis which infected a 12 year old Queensland girl when a dog licked her face.

She developed a chronic gastritis and had to be treated at the Royal Children's Hospital in Brisbane.

I suppose the bottom line of all this is until we determine what undiscovered zoonoses are out there just waiting to infect us and our children, prevention of infection must be the guide-line.

Be it cat or cow, dog or donkey, parrot or pig, whatever and whenever animals are handled, wash your hands thoroughly afterwards - always.

### **SMACD REPORT**

The White Paper & Employment

Last week I attended a Local Employment Initiatives meeting where the White Paper and employment was a major topic. It seems like the Government is prepared to spend more big dollars on schemes to assist the longterm unemployed which all sounds great but how this will benefit places like St Marys is beyond me. It is with great pleasure that we announce that St Marys Landcare Group has been successful in obtaining a grant worth \$850 for the rehabilitation of St Marys Rivulet from the National Landcare Programme.

As part of Arbor Week, 2-8 October we have been involved in a number of tree planting schemes in the area. The first fifty trees and shrubs are being planted along the west bank of St Marys Rivulet. Further trees will be planted along the bank in the next couple of weeks. We also received a request from the students of year 9B at St Marys District High School to assist with the planting of 45 blackwood trees for the school plantation. 




