Let's Look At LETS

WHAT IS LETS?

L E T S has many meanings,
LOCAL EMPLOYMENT
TRADING SYSTEM: developing
employable skills in areas of
unemployment.

LOCAL ENERGY TRANSFER SYSTEM: liberating skills that are not accessible to the conventional monetary system.

LOCAL ENTERPRISE
TRAINING SYSTEM: a low cost
method of conducting business
feasibility systems.

Some people liken LETS to a baby sitting club and it does work along those lines, some people may call it a bartering system and looking very simplistically it is, but it's much more.

LETS is an information system, like a vast community notice board, or a market place.

It is available and useful to anyone who lives in the area served by a LET System.

Individuals and businesses can use it to advertise their goods and services and to locate what they want.

LETS also operates something like a community bank. Each member can open an account and use the mutual credit system to trade locally with other members, when acceptable. Members are free to use the local currency in any way that supports the local community.

HOW DO YOU USE IT?

Anyone who uses money can use LETS.

You can use it to get goods and services from any other members. This could include produce from local growers, nurseries, crafts, used cars, massage, typing, firewood, sewing, haircuts, prepared meals and much more

You get local currency for all of that as well as for teaching sport, music, language skills, gardening, childcare, retail and wholesale trade, and anything else anyone has to offer.

IS IT EASY TO USE?

YES. When two people make a deal they agree on a price to be offered, and whether all or part of that will be paid in local currency.

The local currency is transferred from one account to another by filling in a standard acknowledgement form. It's that simple.

WHAT ADVANTAGES ARE THERE?

Local currency is available, when Federal money is scarce.

You are never in debt, a negative balance means you have issued local money to others, NOT borrowed it from them.

There are:

- NO interest charges
- NO repayment schedules
- NO tight squeezes at the end of the month.

ARE THERE ANY RISKS?

Not unless you want to take them.

You're not liable for other peoples affairs.

You may be liable for tax, depending what you do. Act accordingly.

How about DSS payments? As there are some 100 LETSystems active in Australia, five in Tasmania, this does not appear a major problem.

WHAT IS NATIONAL WATER WEEK?

WHEN STOPPED AT TRAFFIC LIGHTS - REMEMBER THESE TIPS.

1. Check your rear view mirror when stopping and stopped.

2. Leave your vehicle in first gear (at least until all traffic behind is stopped and no danger exists)

3. Leave a safety zone of at least two metres or more when stationary at

a stopline or in a line of stationary traffic.

Remember the Two Second Rule as well, when driving at any speed. Identify a stationary object on the roadside, and when the vehicle in front passes it, count "one thousand and one, one thousand and two" - and if your vehicle passes that point before you've finished saying this phrase - you're too close. Simple!!

WHAT YOU CAN DO TO MAKE YOUR FAMILY SAFER FROM FIRE.

- 1. Put up smoke detectors properly. Keep your smoke detectors clean, and test them every week. DETECTORS THAT DO NOT WORK WILL NOT ALERT YOU...
- 2. Replace your smoke detectors immediately if they are not working properly.
- 3. Follow fire safety rules and prevent hazardous situations:
- * Use smoking materials properly. Never smoke in bed.
- * Keep matches and cigarette lighters away from children.
- * Store flammable materials in proper containers. Never use them near an open flame or sparks.
- * Keep electrical appliances in good condition. Do not overload electrical circuits.
- * Keep stoves, fireplaces, chimneys and barbecue grills grease free, make sure they are properly installed away from any combustible materials.
- * Keep portable heaters and open flames such as candles away from combustible materials.
- * Do no allow rubbish to accumulate.
- * Keep a supply of batteries on hand for your battery powered smoke detectors.
- 4. Develop a family escape plan and practice it with your entire family. Be sure to include small children in your practice.
- * Draw a floor plan of your home and find two ways to exit from each room. There should be one way to get out of each bedroom without opening the door.
- * Explain to children what the smoke alarm detector mean. Teach them that they must be prepared to leave the home by themselves if necessary. Show them how to check to see if doors are hot before opening them. Show them how to use the alternate exit if the door is hot and should not be opened.
- * Decide on a meeting place a safe distance from your house. MAKE sure that all your children understand that they should go and wait for you there if there is a fire.
- * Hold fire drills at least every six months to make sure that everyone, even small children know what to do to escape safely.
- * Know where to call the Fire Brigade from outside your home.

LANDCARE NEWS

by Jan Sparkes

Australia is the world's driest inhabited continent and for much of our history little thought has been given to the efficient provision and use of water resources. Water quality problems such as algae bloom and dry land salting, and the ravages of drought conditions throughout much of Australia is increasing the community awareness of these landcare issues and encouraging everyone of us to develop the necessary skills and strategies to address these problems.

It is important that as a community we recognise that water is a dwindling resource and therefore we all need to be careful not to waste it. In urban areas, the average Australian household uses 250 000 litres of water every year!

The CSIRO booklet entitled "When Should I Water" claims that more domestic gardens fail due to over watering than from lack of water.

Here are some tips for efficient water use in the garden.

- 1 Mulch, mulch, mulch straw, hay, grass clippings, leaves, sawdust, manures, pine bark, pine needles and stones are all valuable ways to keep the ground warm and moist in the cooler months and cool and moist during the summer.
- Water in the evening, infrequently but deeply, this encourages deep rooted plants which are more drought tolerant.
- 3 Improve soil structure to increase its water holding capacity and minimise run-off.
- 4 Grow drought resistant plants, particularly those native to your area. Fortunately there are many native plants that compliment the cottage garden approach. Combine native and exotic plants to create invaluable habitats for butterflies and birds. Callistemons, Grevilleas, native daisies provide hundreds of species. It is worth checking with your local nursery to find out which ones grow well in your area and garden.






