CRAYFISH (ROCK LOBSTER)



LICENCES:

Only non-commercial crayfish pot licence holders may use a craypot for taking crayfish for amateur purposes. The licence authorises the use of one pot only by the licence holder.

CATCH AND POSSESSION LIMIT:

An amateur fisher must not take more than five crayfish in any one day, regardless of what methods of capture are used. No recreational fisher shall have in his possession (boat, car, house, holiday home or elsewhere), more than 10 crayfish unless they have a receipt to verify the legal purchase of any crayfish in excess of that number.

HANDLING CRAYFISH:

It is an offence to take or possess soft shelled crayfish, undersized crayfish and crayfish in berry (carrying eggs); these fish must be returned to the water immediately, in the area from which they were taken. Crayfish must not be taken with a pointed instrument.

MEASURING CRAYFISH:

A commercially produced crayfish-measure or vernier callipers should be used to measure crayfish. Remember, it is your responsibility to ensure that your measuring device is accurate.

To measure the total carapace length of a crayfish, you place the sharp edge of the cray measure between the antennal horns so that it fits hard against the middle notch of the nodule which projects forwards from the carapace.

It may be necessary to carefully spread the antennal horns apart to fit the measure in the correct place. If the other end of the measure reaches beyond the rear edge of the carapace then the fish is not legal size. Be sure to use the correct side of the measure for the sex of the crayfish in question.



TAKE CARE WITH THOSE HOME JOBS

Working around the house and garden is rewarding but it is important to make sure that you take precautions against injury.

Firstly when it is sunny, remember to slip, slop and slap. If you have forgotten, it is slip on a shirt, slap on a hat and slap on some sunscreen.
