EXTRACT FROM AN INDEPENDENT REPORT ON THE TASMANIAN CRIMINAL CODE CRIMES AGAINST THE FAMILY

The Universal Declaration of Human Rights, and common law recognises that the FAMILY UNIT is the basic unit of society and deserves the full protection of the law. There can be no doubt that the Declaration was framed, as was common law developed on the understanding that the Family means the TRADITIONAL Family unit consisting of a female mother, male father, and their children whether natural or by lawful adoption.

It is also well documented that several groups in society have declared and published their intent to change the definition, and to abolish or undermine the traditional Family unit. Such intent, if published constitutes a criminal offence against the Family and Society.

There needs to be a new section of the Criminal Code recognising the obligation of the State to protect the Family and Society from such anti-social conspiracies.

It wiould be criminal offence to disparage the role, definition, composition or function of the traditional Family unit verbally or by any other means. It would not be a criminal offence to report on bona fide studies which may indicate problems arising within families, as long as the intent or summaries is not to disparage the Family unit per se, as that model has consistently served humanity for over 12,000 years. The model may be criticised where it is not seen to be fulfilling its potential, as long as the intent is to restore the potential of the Family unit.

No alternative model should be accorded the status due to the FAMILY, and no alternative should be given any advantage which will cause disadvantage economically, legally, politically or otherwise to the Family unit.

The inclusion of other styles of habitation or household within the term Family should not be accorded legal status, as this would undermine the sanctity and security of the bona fide family. Single parent households, may not be called families in respect to legislation, but may be referred to socially as a family where the parent is the natural parent or legal parent.

Same sex marriage or adoption of children by male or female homosexuals, or in vitro fertilisation of female homosexuals should be unlawful, as against the order of nature, and as contributing to the disorientation of the child, and undermining the security of social order and the family unit.

It would not be against the law for a homosexual female to have custody of her own natural child consequent to a former marriage to a male person, nor for a homosexual male to have custody of his own natural child consequent to a former marriage to a female person, where in either case there are no other factors which would indicate that such custody is against the best interests of the child.

It would certainly be against the interests of the child if the nature of a homosexual relationship were promoted to that child, as it renders the child incapable of discerning the true nature of human relationships, and may contribute to homosexual orientation of the child. As is now the case within heterosexual relationships, if the child, as an adult discovers that their parental role model contributed to a sexual discrientation occasioning actual harm, may seek redress in law from the parent.




