Neighbourhood Watch



What Is Neighbourhood Watch?

Neighbourhood Watch is a community based crime prevention programme. It is aimed at minimising the incidence of preventable crime, especially burglary, within a defined area.

Why Is It Needed

To date traditional methods of policing have proved inadequate in halting the spiralling burglary trate. Without active assistance from the public, the Police Force alone cannot hope to arrest this epidemic of crime.

Where Will It Be?

It is anticipated that eventually Neighbourhood Watch will operate throughout Tasmania within local communities affected by burglaries where there is also a demonstrated community desire to undertake the programme. This ensures maximum protection and assistance in the fight against crime. Many areas in Metropolitan Hobart already have Neighbourhood Watch established. Additional areas will be implemented where there is a high rate of burglary and community interest.

How Does It Start?

The level of interest amongst residents is canvassed, and a public meeting is called. Volunteers are invited to assist with the implementation of the Programme. To facilitate the Programme, an area is defined. From the volunteers, an Area Co-ordinator is elected who is responsible for liaison and information exchange between Police and residents. Zone Leaders are selected and are responsible for fostering co-operation between the residents and their zones, administration of committees, and liaison with the Area and Police Co-ordinators.

What Is Involved?

Residents of Neighbourhood Watch areas are

educated in crime prevention, and through four basic steps, become involved in an active way by:-

- Participating in Operation Identification the marking of valuable household items, such as a television or stereo, with their drivers licence number preceded by the letter "T" for Tasmania.
- 2 Informing residents of the incidence of crime in their area on a monthly basis and advising how to identify and report criminal activity.
- Increasing residents' knowledge of practical; personal and household security.
- 4 Using Sign-posting in areas where Neighbourhood Watch operates as a deterrent to criminal intrusion.

Neighbourhood Watch depends on a commitment to co-operation between neighbours and Police but more importantly between neighbours themselves.

LANDCARE NEWS

Firstly, congratulations to Rick Berriman for obtaining fulltime work, well done! Our LEAP group is now down to a team of five, but I'm sure they will still achieve much good work.

Secondly, September 15-17 has been set aside for the third global clean-up organised in conjunction with the UN Environment Programme, so next weekend will be a good time to reflect upon our environment and see what each and everyone of us can do to improve and clean up our environment.

Nothing could possibly appear to be further from "nature" than that band of grass and weeds which fronts most Australian suburban properties and come to be known as a "nature strip",

Even though the main function of the nature strip is to cover the essential services running under our streets, obviously they do not have to be uninteresting and boring.

Some restrictions and size of plants need to be investigated before planting as possible damage to overhead wire and underground pipes should be a controlling factor, and so curtailing that ridiculous habit of pollarding large trees simply to allow them to grow under wires.

Ground covering species which do not obstruct vision can scramble over sand, gravel or bark chips instead of grass - reduces the need to mow or water which is such a waste of energy. Tough layering plants will soon recover from wear and tear of dogs and children and will allow room for people to alight from cars.

The inclusion of non-invasive grasses such as Poa australis evokes a natural landscape feeling. A simple gravel path with low growing grevilleas softening the edges.

Grevilleas

Austraflora Canterbury gold

Curviloba - known previously as biternata, (white)

Forest rambler (yellow-pink)

Juniperina (white) are all very hardy and suitable species.

Brachyscome multifida (mauve) and the grey-leafed

Helichrysum apiculatum (yellow) look delightful.

Asperula gunnii - is a suckering herb reminiscent of moss which flowers in summer with small white starlike flowers. It is tolerant of shade and most soils and poor drainage.

Ajuga australis - pink, mauve to purple to a height of 30 cms are a few plants suitable for nature strips.

Here are but a few ideas to help create an Australian landscape - to act responsibly, to keep Australia beautiful and create a tidy town.

TOTAL SEA FISHING FOR THE FUTURE

What is it all about?
