ST MARYS DISTRICT HOSPITAL Support Association Inc

The St Marys' District Hospital Support Association Inc (Committee) are still engaged in the difficult process to ensure full and proper health services are maintained at the St Marys District Hospital.

To date public meetings, lobbying, and lately a legislative Council Select Committee investigating health needs in the Fingal Valley and surrounding Coastal Region, including Scamander and Bicheno have resulted from their hard work.

The Committee is most concerned with the downgrading of the Hospital including removal of the aged care beds. The privately run aged care beds at Medea Park are a great asset to the greater region on the North Eastern side of the Break O'Day Municipality, but with population further afield serviced by St Marys it is also desirable that some aged care places should be provided at St Marys District Hospital.

It is not envisaged that these places would interfere with services or funding at Medea Park as both State and Federal funds are being sought for the places at St Marys. The Committee spokesperson Mrs Cheryl Hendley stated that "It is morally wrong to force old people to move out of their communities to locations which are unfamiliar and remote from their own areas"! Mrs Hendley further stated that "We (the Committee and local communities) may have to gear up for another round if we fail to achieve our objectives through our efforts so far".

It is further hoped that fairness will prevail in the provision of health services in the region.

Places for the aged should be spread out to meet the needs and desires of everyone. Most people supporting that concept state that it also makes sense to be closer to the major health facilities.

The Committee has been able to maintain its momentum simply because it does have the full support of the communities surrounding the Hospital. Mrs Rona Gatty of the Committee wished to offer a sincere thank you to these supporters and stated that "Without their support we would never have been able to make it this far".



WATER SAFETY

For CHILDREN UNDER SCHOOL AGE, the most important thing is SUPERVISION.

- Under the age of about six, no children are "water safe", even if they have had swimming lessons.
- Make sure your young children NEVER play in or near water unless a responsible adult is close by and has them in full view.
- If there are several children, more than one adult is needed
- NEVER leave young children alone near a swimming pool, even for the time it takes to go the telephone.
- Any swimming lessons for a child less than four years old should be on a one-to-one basis, not one adult for a group of children.

SCHOOL AGE CHILDREN need to be educated in SKILLS and CONCEPTS of water safety, so that they can form sound judgements about their own ability and about any difficulties.

 A competent instructor should teach everyone in your family how to swim and how to apply mouth-to-mouth resuscitation.

ADULTS need to remember the danger of ALCOHOL. Most adults who drown have not intended to go into the water, have been fully clothed, and have been drinking alcohol. The obvious conclusion is:

If you've been drinking alcohol, don't go near the water.





BREAK O'DAY COUNCIL NEWS

Tasbash

The Variety Club of Australia have advised Council that the CUB Carlton - Variety Tasbash '95 will be passing through the Break O'Day Municipality on the 18th & 19th of October with an overnight stop in St Helens on the 18th.

Tasmanian Timber Sheds

The Local Government Association of Tasmania have received support from Council for a project that they are promoting, which will document and market Tasmania's unique collection of timber sheds. The Association are suggesting a Statewide project to identify, photograph and research the history of all the timber sheds that can be seen from the road. This information would be put into a glossy photograph publication and tourist map to encourage tourists to undertake a 'Timber Shed Trail'. Federal Government funding is being sought for this proposal.

St Helens Tourist Brochure

The St Helens District Chamber of Commerce are currently organising the re-printing of the St Helens Tourist Brochure. Council have agreed to support his publication by placing a small advertisement. Town Planning

Town planning is probably the Council activity that received the greatest amount of attention from the public. At times conflict can arise due to the requirements of the planning scheme that the Break O'Day Council inherited at the time of amalgamation and state government legislation. During the last twelve months the Coastal and Marine management Strategy has been completed and during the next twelve months a New Planning Scheme is to be implemented and the Federal Government is funding a

Georges Bay Integrated Local Area Planning Study.

Temporary Offices

Due to renovations of the St Helens Municipal offices. Council is currently operating from temporary offices at Pendrigh Place and Tully Street. General enquiries and payment of accounts should be made at Pendrigh Place and services such as town planning, health, plumbing and building inspection are housed at the Sports Complex in Tully Street. Fingal operations remain the same apart from being closed for lunch from 100 to 1.40 pm.

Pam Lynch's garden by contrast is open, framing views of the Fingal Valley and distant Ben Lomond, still covered with snow. Mr & Mrs Des Williams' garden is a wonderful mix of exotic and native shrubs and trees covering the whole of the front garden, making it look rich and exciting and a delight for our bird life. Thank you for opening your gardens to the judges.

A recent trip to Gray Mares Tail Reserve was also very pleasing. The job to enhance the area is just about complete, a great achievement! Six months of hard work by a team of young LFAP workers has turned a litter-strewn, weed infested area into a very pleasant short walk and picnic area.

The second group of LEAPers in our area, now half way through their work experience and training are also going from strength to strength transforming unsightly, degraded areas of public land into attractive community assets, adding value to the town for its residents and visitors. A great effort by the young people and their supervisors and something of which they can all be justly proud. Some much needed rain fell at last, nowhere near enough no doubt, but very welcome nevertheless. The young seedlings planted in the last few months lapped it up. Let's hope we receive some follow up rains in the next couple of weeks.

Mike Cassidy from Water Watch will be at St Marys District High School next week to instruct science staff in the monitoring of our water. More on this topic in the near future.

- Development services and environmental health.


Participants are to be selected on the basis of experience and knowledge in these areas.
