'THEY' ARE YOU AND I!

How often do we hear someone say 'It's a disgrace, **they** should do something about it'. 'They', of course are always meant to be somebody else, perhaps persons in authority. At the local level the reference to 'they' frequently implicates the Municipal Council, in the mistaken belief that these organisations and their staff have the power and ability to solve every problem. Even less charitably, Councils are frequently blamed for actually causing the day to day difficulties which offend or inconvenience their constituents.

The irony is that the imposition of increased responsibilities on local government, has coincided with significantly less nett funding to meet the demands of rationalisation, and the enhanced public perceptions of services required. Nowhere is this dilemma more evident than in the vexed question of coastal and marine management. Even defining the many problems is a daunting task, let alone solving them.

Aware of this, and the importance of an integrated approach, the three east coastal municipalities, Dorset, Break O'Day and Glamorgan/Spring Bay commissioned a professional organisation called TASQUE to prepare a Coastal and Marine Management Strategy. The group's first move was to conduct a series of public consultation forums, at selected locations within each of the

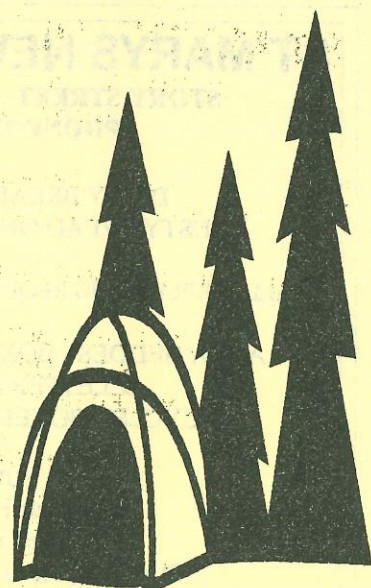
three municipalities, at this interested citizens were encouraged to air their views about the various issues as they saw them. As well, scientists, biologists and ecologists, both amateur and professional, were approached individually and invited to make written submissions.

A wealth of useful information emerged, and from it has come TASQUE's first project report involving summaries of all the data gleaned from the team's opening gambit. Several copies of this report have been distributed and there are more at Council offices. Anyone with an interest in the future management and development of Tasmania's eastern seaboard should make it their business to obtain and read a copy. It is an excellent synopsis of the formidable list of problems to be solved.

One thing which becomes instantly evident is that even if all three Councils spent their entire financial and human resources countering the perceived concerns of dune erosion, water pollution, weed invasion, catchment management, inadequate biological knowledge, historical site preservation and sustainable land use, they would not even, to use an old cliché, scratch the surface.

So, just as the community has

rallied around Annette Wines and her committee in their laudable endeavour to preserve and improve the township of St Marys and its environs, so too will the general public have to take a keen interest in the unfolding Coastal and Marine Management Strategy. In other words, 'they' are not 'them', but you and I.

Council is seeking applicants for a cleaner for Council Buildings in the Fingal area.

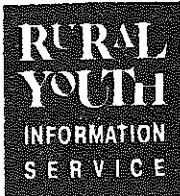

RURAL YOUTH INFORMATION SERVICE

I've often heard, or read in the paper, that people have concerns about the availability of the Department of Social Security Independent Homeless Rate payment (previously called the Young Homeless Allowance). I thought it would be helpful to give a summary of the payment guidelines which appeared in the Northern Youth Forum Newsletter of April 1995. If you need more detailed information regarding eligibility for and assessment of Independent Homeless Rate please contact a DSS Social Worker.

Independent Homeless Rate (IHR) is payable to homeless persons under 18 years of age. It is not a payment in its own right, but is the higher rate of Job Search Allowance, Youth Training Allowance, Sickness Allowance or Special Benefit.

To be eligible for payment of IHR, a young person must first establish eligibility for a basic income support payment (JSA, YTA, SA, SB).

Where an IHR claim is made, investigation of the claim is commenced immediately, and is carried out by a social worker. The type of investigation will depend on the reasons the young person is not living in the parental home:

- * they have no parental home;
- * they are unable to live at home because family breakdown has led to parents refusing to allow the young person to live with them;

or

- * domestic violence, sexual abuse, or other exceptional circumstances exist in the parental home, which make it unreasonable for the young person to live in that home.

Note: Other exceptional circumstances may include serious neglect, psychological abuse, substance abuse, psychiatric illness, criminal activity in the home, or a long history of domestic disharmony

The homeless rate will not be solely based on the grounds that:

- ♦ parents state that they cannot afford to support the young person;
- ♦ parents are in inadequate housing or there is a lack of room;
- ♦ parents live in an isolated area with a lack of access to training;
- ♦ the young person refuses to live at home rather than comply with reasonable parental requests;
- ♦ the young person wishes to have greater independence;
- ♦ parents move house and the young person does not wish to go with them.

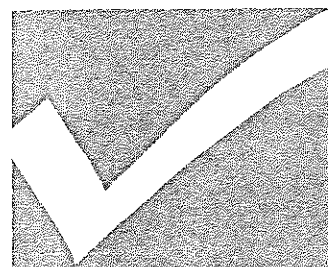

Students - payment of IHR

Where the claimant for IHR is a full time student, and is aged 16 years and over, s/he should contact the Department of Employment, Education and Training (DEET), who can make an equivalent payment if the client qualifies for Austudy. If the claimant is aged under 16 years, and is a full time student, s/he may be paid the homeless rate and Special Benefit. Part time students over the age of 16 years may be eligible for IHR if they qualify for Youth Training Allowance or Job Search Allowance.

Payment of IHR cannot be approved to persons who claim on the basis that severe family breakdown has led to them not being allowed to live at home, or on the basis of a history of long term domestic disharmony, without parents being contacted. It is necessary to discuss family relationships with parents to establish whether family breakdown has occurred. In these claims, verification from one other relevant and credible third party (apart from parents) is also recommended.

Contact with parents is not generally initiated where allegations of abuse are made. In such cases the social worker will determine whether contact with a young person's parent is appropriate.

In situations where abuse is alleged, verification can be sought from medical or police records, State Welfare Departments, youth agencies, schools, counselling services, non abusing parents, or other individuals nominated by the young person. Information provided from sources whose only knowledge is what they have been told by the young person, will usually require further corroboration or investigation.

Advice to Parents - Welfare of the Child

Claimants for Young Homeless Allowance will be encouraged to allow the Department to contact their parents for the sole purpose of advising them that their child has been in contact with the Department about getting income support.

Education Leavers

Where an education leaver claims YTA, SA or JSA, and meets the eligibility criteria for IHR, s/he may have the education leaver deferment period waived, if in hardship.

Education leavers who transfer from Austudy/Abstudy at the Student Homeless Rate (SHR), may be granted DSS income support at the homeless rate without further investigation, subject to:

- ❖ DEET being contacted to verify (in writing) that SHR was paid;
- ❖ the claimant providing a declaration that relevant circumstances are unchanged.

Assessment of Young Homeless Allowance - contact with parents

Parental contact in the assessment of IHR is seen as desirable for several reasons:

- to provide basic information about their child's well-being, and to allay fears that most parents have if they have lost touch with a child;
- to give parents an opportunity to give their views about family circumstances and their relationship with their child;
- to explore the possibility of and appropriateness of mediation, counselling or family therapy;
- to consider the broader issues affecting the family such as income support changes and non-financial needs;
- to discuss the provision of continuous support.

All contacts with parents will be made by Departmental social workers.

Receipt of Support

The Homeless Rate is not payable where certain forms of support are received from a parent, long term guardian, government department or instrumentality on a continuing basis. Any amount of continuous support may preclude payment of IHR. To be considered as continuous, support must have a regularity or stability which gives the claimant the expectation that it will be received. Non-monetary support may also be considered as continuous support.

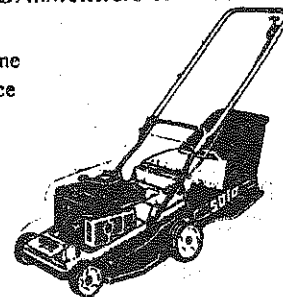

Where support is being received, there may not be any need to assess whether the claimant satisfies the other criteria for IHR, as receipt of the support renders the claimant ineligible. The claimant will still be referred to other support services where necessary.

Wards of State

Wards of State under the age of 16 years are not eligible for IHR. Wards of State aged 15 to 17 who are eligible for Job Search or Sickness Allowance may qualify for the Homeless Rate, if normal eligibility criteria are met.

Rate of Payment

A recipient of IHR is paid at the equivalent of the Independent Rate of JSA, currently \$222.00 per fortnight. If the claimant is paying private board or rent, they may be also eligible for Rent Assistance. Where eligibility for IHR has not yet been established, but entitlement to JSA already exists, then JSA can be paid at the minimum rate in the interim.
