While we the spectators are surely going to miss those cold and wet winter gatherings, we will no doubt find something else to occupy our Saturday afternoons.

To my way of thinking the real loser in this decision is our youth.

The Valley has very little to offer the youngsters in both towns.

Football didn't only cater for the players and may I add two teams involves some fifty kids, but it also involved the players brothers and sisters.

Football has been a social event for the entire family, and the season gave these kids something to look forward to for close on five months of the year.

What do we have to offer to replace this institution? One parent has approached me with the suggestion of having a junior team entered in the Esk comp. It would be great I am sure, but with my little knowledge of the football administration I would imagine all types of problems, with unpopular byes having to be introduced. Maybe there is a parent of one of the under 16's who would like to investigate the options and viability of the suggestion. Maybe the schools and parents could inititate a local comp to be played between Avoca, St Marys and Fingal. I don't profess to have any answers, and I am simply expressing my

concerns in the hope that there may be enough parents out there who will be effected by the loss of football in the Valley, who will attempt to come up with some alternative.


One thing is for sure, if there is no football in the Valley for the juniors, there will never be football for the seniors. After all where does one gain their experience if they are not playing in an under 16 comp

### PENGUIN DISTRICT RE -VISITED

After a sojourn at Somerset I stayed for several days with my sister & brother in law at the Don. The weather happened to be fine so we took the opportunity to go driving and picnicking. One day we went to Cradle Mountain going through Spreyton & Latrobe.

Going through Spreyton I was wondering what all the fuss over the new milk depot was about and how the use of the small amount of coal they were going to use could spoil the environment. The road to Cradle is very winding ,worse bends than on our passes and much longer, the only difference not much traffic. On the way we stopped at craft shops and a little cottage where the young lass was weaving her coats, scarfs and shawls, they were beautiful, she even sewed the coats herself - they were fantastic. The craft shops were all the samewoodwork, beautifully finished but very expensive, if they had home made cooking, especially bread a very ready market. Hand painting in oils of the mountain in different seasons were in the vicinity of \$350.00 unframed to \$600-700 framed. Books on Tasmania were a great buy...

On another day we went through Hampshire and picniced at Lake Melrose. Another very winding road, very thick bush, but also not much traffic. On the return trip we decided to come down into South Riana & Riana and Penguin. Now I was in very familiar country, picking out fields where I used to play hockey- no mowed ovals or synthetic fields, the farmers lent us their paddocks. At South Riana we stopped at the Pioneer Park for afternoon tea. This park maintained by the farmers was a credit. There were four caravans stopping there - all from other parts, Western Australia, South Australia and The park had toilets, showers. Queensland. barbecues, places to boil jugs and taps, all conveniences were housed in buildings made of stones connected together - no upkeep.

The C.W.A. had a Memorial Garden, beautifully maintained and a riot of colour. The playground was well sanded. Comments from the visitors "so peaceful, so clean ,a good place to have as a base to see other places".

Driving through West-pine and later Forth, farmers were busy harvesting their crops of beans, sweet corn, onions and some potatoes. Although people were so busy in their farms and market gardens, people were not stopping. Shops were very bare of people - a sign of the times, I even saw my old High School. The impressive front of the old entrance - at least the playing fields are there: tennis courts, football and hockey fields.

I love going to the North - West Coast but I love where I live now - it's peaceful.



This equipment includes the like of engravers that can be borrowed from Neighbourhood Watch to engrave your personal items such as TV's, videos etc... as described in the householder kit, as well as signs that will be placed around the area.

#### CRIME REPORT

#### UNNECESSARY DESTRUCTION

Recently in the community there has been several cases of wilful damage to property.

There was an excavator purposefully put over the St Marys Pass on the long weekend, which is totally unnecessary. This type of equipment is very expensive and is somebody's livelihood.

The roof to the reservoir at Cornwall was damaged recently, apparently by rocks being thrown through the roof. This kind of destruction must be avoided as it is dangerous and can cause major problems to the Cornwall water supply by letting contaminates into the reservoir This in turn causes illness to ALL people who use the water.

Someone knows something about these crimes, it is important that this info is reported to police or crime stoppers. They may not be able to prosecute the felons due to lack of evidence but they can talk to them and keep a close watch on them and this way prevent further crime by them.



## LANDCARE NEWS

There will be a TREE PLANTING and WORKING BEE on the St Marys District High School farm on SATURDAY 20TH APRIL AT 10 AM.

The school farm has been officially leased by Parents & Friends

Association and a five member subcommittee is in charge of the day-today running of the farm.

Currently the farm is somewhat rundown and it has become an urgent matter to make it into an interesting and exciting learning adjunct to this excellent and beautifully situated school.

Some five months ago the St Marys Landcare Group sponsored LEAP group with the aid of Doug Preece's mulcher, Lohrey's excavator and Troy Dawson's truck removed some six or seven large old willow trees from an 80m bank of St Patricks Rivulet running through the school farm. This area is now ready for a revegetation program. What should we plant? you may well ask. The answer, in this situation, is native plants that occur in similar areas elsewhere on the creek. Such plants pre adapted to the typical

environmental condition of the area and as such will generally be hardy and fast growing.

So come along on Saturday 20th, bring along the family, friends,

some garden tools, strong foot wear, old clothing, a hat, sun block and have a great day planting sedges, saggs, herbaceous plants and shrubs and some larger trees.

We also need people prepared to repair and paint the farm

St Marys Landcare Group and the school farm committee are very active groups but the problems at the school farm are bigger than these groups can confront alone. 
