

# FALMOUTH CHURCH ON THE MOVE by Tim McManus

About a fortnight ago a mini-historical event occurred at Falmouth. After being accommodated on "Glencoe" farm for nigh on half a century, the little Falmouth church was relocated to the site of the township's old cemetery. The move was necessary because the new coastal highway had significantly reduced accessibility to the building.

It was not the first time the church had been translocated. Originally it was the Hadspen Primary School, one of many such single room, multiple class, education establishments formerly dotted around Tasmania's rural areas. There is



another at Upper Esk, still on its original site, and recently refurbished by local residents for a community centre. There is an identical one too at Royal George township, moved there from its former position a couple of kilometres down the road towards Avoca. It also has recently been renovated for community use.


Moving the Falmouth church presented building contractor, Barry Mudford, with several problems. Firstly, the building was very old and rather 'creaky'. Secondly, it had once incorporated a fireplace which had subsequently been removed, leaving an unstable gap in part of the floor. Thirdly, it was not known in how many pieces the school had been brought from Hadspen, and where the weak joins were. It had quite obviously not been relocated intact, because in those days the St Marys Pass was only a narrow dirt track.

Preliminary preparations were lengthy and thorough. Nevertheless on removal day, when Tom Hendley began to

hoist up the church's reinforced base, prior to backing his low loader beneath it, the building began to separate into three sections. At that stage Barry Mudford was probably quite glad he had taken Gilbert Schier's advice and removed all the window joinery. But nobody panicked. More strategic shoring-up began, and by early afternoon Falmouth's place of workship was safely balanced, intact, on the Hendley transporter.

After that, everything was a breeze. All previous measurements of space between gateways, beneath electric wires, and around corners en-route, proved correct, and though the Hydro were standing by, no mishaps resulted. With great skill Tom Hendley eventually backed the church-laden trailer into the prepared foundations, onto which the building was lowered without further incident. It was a tribute to all concerned that such a tricky operation was conducted so efficiently.

Since then Mr Mudford has started to construct a new ramp access, prior to preparing Falmouth's only place of worship for the first service on its new site. Thanks, from the people of Falmouth, go to him, Tom Hendley and their skilled helpers; not forgetting Mrs Mudford who very kindly took the opportunity to clean all the windows while the joinery was detached.

### ST MARYS HOSPITAL New Maternity Block Opened

A new wing of the St Marys Hospital was opened by the Attorney -General (Mr E. J. Ogilvie) on Saturday.

The President (Mr R. W. Legge) said that during it's 10 years of existence the hospital had treated \$1,319 patients. The commercial benefits of the hospital to the district was indicated by the fact that provisions cost \$\frac{10}{2}0\$ a year, wood and coal \$\frac{1}{2}0\$, repairs \$\frac{1}{2}0\$ and wages and salaries amounted to \$\frac{1}{2}0\$. The new wing, primarily for maternity cases had been built during a year in which no appeal had been made to the public. The wing was built with \$\frac{1}{2}000\$ from the Jubilee Fund 500 from the Hartnoll Bequest and \$\frac{1}{2}000\$ from the E.B. Bromley Bequest. The Government's annual subsidy was \$\frac{1}{2}000\$. If the people of the district contributed more by becoming members the Government would consider allocating a larger grant.

The hospital was a district institution and it should be supported by the Fingal and Portland Municipalities.

The Attorney-General congratulated the Board Members on their achievement. He said a fine community spirit existed at St Marys considering the effects of industrial troubles.

The Director of Public Health (Dr B. M. Curruthers) said the hospital was efficiently furnished and the maternity block was as good as any in the State. Messrs C.S.F. Hood and C.F. Salter appealed for greater public assistance.

Two courses will be offered and you are asked to complete the details below and return to the school office as soon as possible.





# ITISA WOMAN'S WORLD? Ly Gary Dalin

Don't let anyone tell you that it is a Our districts' woman's world. pioneering women would tell you differently, at least the ones that I have knowledge of. They are the ones from the early part of this century, at about the time we call 'the good old days'. Prior to this, things would probably have been a lot worse than the tales I am going to tell

Up until the end of World War II only the well to do families had washing machines or refrigerators, of course the machines on the market were not very The first washing special either. machines I saw were hand operated, they washed while ever someone turned the handle, fridges were big heavy things that iced up all the time.

Washing was normally a weekly chore with washing day being a very tiring day. Some of my elderly informants tell me of seeing women washing clothes in the local creeks.

I can personally remember many women washing outside with kerosene tins boiling on fires and no shelter at all.

But the women I am describing now are really the ones who had the luxury of a wash house and a copper. Firstly the copper had to be boiled with the boilable clothes in it, then they needed scrubbing either on a washing board or with a scrubbing brush in concrete troughs (pronounced troves). After many rinses

by hand they were rung out again by hand, starched in most cases, rung again and hung on a wire clothes line mainly strung across the bottom of the vard and held up by saplings called clothes props.

Joy oh joy, when they were dry. They had to be ironed with flat irons heated on fires. It was hard to get them to the right temperature and one needed to

keep the bottom clean enough to iron white clothes.

h washing copper was also used to heat

water for the weekly bath.

The copper also served to boil the Christmas ham, sterilise the bottles of preserved fruit, so you can see it was a pretty useful item.

The woodburning stove that most houses had was not the "House and Garden" enamelled type, but a black cast iron model that needed lots of black-leading with a brush to make it look good. The brick fireplaces also need a coat of red ochre. Of course the lady of the house also had to daily clean out the ashes.

Toilets or outside loos as they were called needed scrubbing and disinfected with Phenyle or a few wood ashes in the pan. Wooden floors and linoleum in the house needed to be scrubbed and polished, all on the hands and knees of course.

Cooking took a lot of time as most had to cook cakes, biscuits and puddings for a tribe of children, this was of course in the better days when they had access to bakers bread, otherwise bread had to be baked also. In season, food excesses had to be preserved or made to sauce, pickles or jam etc.

Some women were expected to tend the vegie garden, milk the cow, feed the animals and perhaps even chop a bit of They also had occasional wood. shopping trips to obtain what could not be made or grown.

There was always clothes to mend, make, or alter and things to knit. Most of these things to be achieved before the bread winner arrived home after a hard day at the mine. In lots of cases these chores were performed in a state of perpetual pregnancy and with two or three small children holding onto their

I suppose the only consolation is that the norm in those days said that married women did not go out to work. Lucky they weren't expected to work on top of their normal chores.

I am writing this from memories from my growing up years with no exaggerations at all. It is possible that things were worse than I thought, certainly not better.




# Labour Employment Initiative Scheme

Bruce attended school at St Marys and worked after school from 14 at the service station he now owns.
