



## KITCHEN STAINS EASY TO DEFEAT

Kitchenware often becomes discoloured and stained with regular use but the Lever & Kitchen Advisory Service has some hints to restore it to its original sparkling state.

Stained china should be soaked in a solution of warm water with a few squirts of household disinfectant cleaner, such as Domestos and rinsed well.

However, avoid using this solution on items with silver or gold trims or those which are chipped or cracked.

Chopping boards, jars and containers which have been filled with strong smelling ingredients such as garlic frequently hold the offensive odour for long periods of time.

A solution of cold water and household disinfectant cleaner will also be effective in this situation if the items are soaked for a couple of hours.

An overnight soak in such a solution should remove all traces of tannin from tea cups, mugs and teapots.

One of the most dreaded kitchen chores, cleaning the over, is made easier by pouring one cup of strong household cleaner containing ammonia, such as Handy Andy, into a tub with enough hot water to easily cover the grill trays and oven racks. Soak these for several hours, then rub clean with a scouring pad and rinse well.

Clean the oven with a cream cleanser, such as Jif and scrub with a scouring pad to remove baked on grease, rinsing well with warm water before wiping clean.

It is advisable to wear rubber gloves when using cleaners containing ammonia and to cover your nose and mouth if you are particularly sensitive to strong fumes.



#### Changes to DSS Rules for Volunteering by Unemployed People

The Department of Social Security has introduced changes making it easier for unemployed people to do voluntary work as an alternative to active job search.

People aged 50 years and over are now able to do unlimited amounts of voluntary work as long as they do at least 32 hours per fortnight, approved by the CES, and with an approved not-for-profit organisation. These people will no longer have to report their job search efforts to the DSS, but must still be available to take paid work or referral to a job interview. Potential volunteers who are unemployed and over 50 might be referred to organisations by either the CES, private case managers, or the Volunteer Centre's Referral Service.

The DSS has indicated that all Volunteer Centre member organisations will automatically be considered "approved" organisations.

The rules on volunteer work undertaken by other unemployed people have also been relaxed, and it is still possible for all unemployed people to undertake up to twenty hours per week of volunteer work as long as they continue to demonstrate adequate job search.

More changes in DSS policy and practices are anticipated for September 1997.

Murray is well, I'm actually employed and Rob is off the coast of Brazil!!


