Their task will be to compile an inventory of the state of buildings, facilities, parks etc. - review current activities - develop policies and programmes and allocate responsibility - set goals and targets - establish evaluation mechanisms - develop and implement a communication and training programme.

# Misuse of public litter bins costing you money

Everyday Council works staff spend a considerable amount of time emptying public litterbins of domestic or household garbage. As a ratepayer this is costing you money.

These public bins are provided for the disposal of street litter only. Dumping household garbage in these bins is pure laziness on the part of people who cannot be bothered travelling to a Council operated waste transfer or tipping site. The contents of these garbage bags often give us an indication as to which household they originated from and can often be traced back to the offender. All offenders will be asked to account for their actions.

## FIRE SAFETY starts with you!

EVERY YEAR in Australia, fire destroys millions of dollars worth of property and personal possessions, and claims many lives and causes horrific burns.

Yet in many instances the fires are caused by human error, carelessness and/or complacency by otherwise sensible, intelligent people.

It's not often known or recognised that the occupants of a building on fire can become very ill or even die from smoke inhalation.

Even if the fire is confined to a small area, or just smoulders, and doesn't present an immediate threat to lives, the toxic fumes given off by plastics and similar materials can mix with the smoke to make a lethal cocktail.

An inexpensive smoke alarm can detect the smoke and alert occupants so that they can escape!

The Tasmanian Fire Service has published a brochure which gives terrific fire prevention advice for a range of everyday situations.

With their permission and our grateful thanks we have reprinted some of the handy hints.

- ♦ Is the Fire Brigade phone number on the telephone?
- Are all electric light bulbs so arranged or guarded that they never touch any material and set it on fire?
- Are all the cords to lamps and other electrical applicances in good repair and out in the open, not under rugs or through doorways?
- Is your house number visible from the street so that emergency vehicles can find you?
- Do you have a smoke alarm installed in your home? Is it tested monthly?
- Do you sleep with your bedroom door closed to allow you the time to escape before smoke enters? A smoke alarm should be fitted.
- Do you have a fire extinguisher in your home?
- Is your garden hose permanently attached to the tap and does it reach all points of the house.

#### **CORNWALL HISTORY**

Once upon a time this proud little country township boasted at least six general purpose shops plus a Post Office -Apart from Lou Maney's butcher's Shop and the bakery the other shops stocked everything one ever needed.

Probably better stocked than our stores in St Marys today. At Burkett's one could buy our groceries, nails etc, boots and shoes, wood, dresses, sheets, material by the yard and for the miner- carbide (for his pit lamp). Stuarts store held the same range of goods and as it was in the centre of the township probably was handier for some people. Later this store was taken over by Dawborn's and managed by Miss Cavel Haas. When the Post Mistress (Mrs Targett) retired the Post Office was stationed there. The last owner of the shop was Nancy Graham.

When Mrs Targett had the Post Office it was often a meeting place, as the mail came twice daily by train (morning & afternoon) most people came at 4.30pm for their mail.

Lou Maney would call in the morning for the meat order and deliver it so you could cook it for tea. (We had no freezers or fridges then).

When you think back Cornwall lost their identity when the mine closed down, people having to move to find employment.

Also when thinking over the years 1936 to about 1945, the years the miners were fighting for a living wage - how good the shop keepers were to the people- they must have carried a few bad debts but also I know that the miners with pride would pay off their debts. They were a very proud bunch of people. Una Camplin

With support and assistance of people such of these, the future of the school farm seems assured.


The grounds also provided a magnificent backdrop for the primary cross-country - which in turn gave the calves and steers a great afternoon's entertainment.




# COUNCIL INVOLVEMENT BRINGS OVER ONE MILLION DOLLARS INTO REGION



### LANDCARE NEWS

Tasmania's trees are in decline in the low rainfall districts of this state. Locally, the extent of die back varies according to the site conditions, the size of the remnant of bush, soil type or depth and past land management practices. Changing climate, possums and insects are all implicated in this decline of our rural trees, especially amongst eucalypts.

The white gum or Eucalyptus viminalis is the tree most affected by dieback. This was the dominant tree in the Midlands and was widely distributed throughout region. As it has nutritious and palatable foliage it is very attractive to possums and insects.

All the rainfall charts of the region indicate that there has been a sustained dry period in Tasmania since the mid 1970's with only average or below average rainfalls since about 1975, and the stress caused by drought is a major factor in rural tree decline.

There is no doubt about it that European settlement of Tasmania has resulted in very significant changes to the environment. In the lower rainfall areas over 95% of the original vegetation has been changed by clearing, the introduction of exotic grasses and weeds, and by grazing. The introduction of superphosphates has caused chemical changes to the soil and the grazing animals have compacted the soils.

In the longer term there is nothing that can be done to save old paddock trees, if only through old age, these trees are going to die. Where it is not possible to establish natural regeneration, new areas of trees need to be established through plantings or direct sowing of seed.

In order to ensure regeneration it is important that the area is fenced off; not to exclude stock totally but to control stock movement. Where trees are only providing nesting sites for possums and/or starlings, which is often the case with isolated dead or dying paddock trees, they are better off removed.

At St Marys District High School a number of old eucalypts have been removed to make way for a swift parrot reserve and a future saw log resource. With the assistance of Robin Costain from Forestry Tasmania and through Private Forests Tasmania the Junior Landcare Group will be planting approximately a thousand trees this spring.

Many thanks to all the people who helped with the working bee last weekend to split and stack the wood from the trees felled to clear the area for the proposed plantation.
