SIGHT & SOUND PLAYGROUND

How it came to be.

The St Marys 1996 Leap Scheme commenced on Tuesday 5th March for a period of 6 months ending with a certificate presentation and BBQ on Friday 30th August at 12 noon.

The Scheme comprised of various projects allocated by Murray Luttrell from D.E.L.M. at St Helens and Drew Adam the Broker for Break O' Day Municipality.

The team was made up of one adult supervisor namely Henry and nine trainees, Troy, Kimbra, Kristen, Cameron, Michael, John, Andrew, Cathy and Lyle. It is primarily designed by academics for city type teenagers who have had little or no experience in rural life style or environmental management.

After completion of various projects such as, completion of Grays Mare Tail Waterfall walking track, removal of blackberries and willows from St Marys rivulet behind the library off Frank Street, construction of footpath through Progress Park at Scamander, clearing weeds and cottoneasters from around grave sites at Gray Road Cemetery, collation of all names and relevant historical data from both Cullenswood church cemetry and catholic cemetry opposite Cornwall turnoff and passing this information on to the library to be put on computer records, a more challenging task was requested by the team of their supervisor.

A chance conversation with Annette Wines from SMACD resulted in meetings with Council and the Streetscape Committee for Council to provide all materials so that the "team" could construct a Sight and Sound Playground above the old swimming pool site on the banks of the St Marys Rivulet.

As the Leap Schemes require 40% of the trainees time to be spent in a classroom situation attending courses such as chainsaw operators certificate, senior first aid certificate, occupation health and safety, plant identification, plant cultural practices, conservation concepts, workplace communication, business calculations and job seeking skills, only 42 working days remained to complete the construction of "St Marys Sight and Sound Playground" weather permitting.

Unfortunately due to the budget cutback, the Federal Government have seen fit to cancel this scheme. I feel that this is a retrograde step because although it doesn't provide jobs, the scheme helps prepare the trainees for the workforce by learning discipline and punctuality and working as a team. St Marys Community has a facility

It has been designed to allow children & adults to explore the sound and composition of music, with conventional tunes able to be Besides the musical played on the instruments. instruments such as large cast bells and a marimba (percussion instrument resembling a xylophone) there is a major sight feature included in the project. The large outdoor kaleidoscope is made from stainless steel and is believed to be one of the first to be erected in Australia. The St Marys Streetscape Project consultants identified the playground as opportunity to construct a unique

attraction within St Marys. Layout, design and construction of the playground was undertaken by Henry Biggelaar and a team of our local youth under a LEAP project which was funded by the Department of Environment and Land Management, with the assistance of Local Council. The plan includes a concrete path and a half pipe which will offer our local children an area to practise their skateboard and roller blading skills. A foot bridge across the rivulet to the public toilets is included in the plans and local artist Lorraine Biggs has applied for further funding through Arts Tasmania to construct an interpretive path (depicting local history) to the area. If Lorraine's application is successfull, she will be working with local school children early in 1997. The St Marys Streetscape committee, Break O'Day Council and SMACD inc are presently working together in an attempt to have the project ready for an official opening on Tasmania Day. project ready for an official opening on Tasmania Day. SMACD will be holding a raffle in October to raise further funds for the project and would like to hear from volunteers who could assist in the construction of the skate ramp.



CREATION OF 1500 JOBS ON EAST COAST A POSSIBILITY

If the Tasmanian Government grants racing group Teletrak a licence to operate proprietary racing in the state it is estimated it will generate 1500 jobs in this area as they propose to establish a racing track facility at Chain of Lagoons.

Sale agreements have been exchanged for the prestige Chain of Lagoons property with the vendors.

The intended racing course, a 2000 metre all-weather, grass straightline track will be installed on the property to provide night telecasts to a world-wide audience. Other features of this region and the 2500 hectare property and it's 17 km ocean frontage will be screened in an eight minute documentary at the commencement of each broadcast. Obviously this kind of focus will be extremely favourable to tourism. According to Councillor Stephen Salter who initiated the approach to Teletrak, the economic benefits to the Break O' Day Municipality and the state were massive. Not only will it create employment, promote tourism and generate overseas earnings, but it will also fit in with our "clean green image".

"All it now requires is for the Minister Mr Bonde and government to show initiative".




