Next issue read about the St Marys man who was a many times motorcycle road racing champion on the mainland.

Queenslanders Brian McArdle and Les Bentlin broke the newly set world record and stole the World Championship title with a new record time of 1.50.85. McGiveron and Floyed came second with a time of 1.53.66.

Third in the roofbolting was former record holders Darren Bean and Tony Ward (2.10.72); fourth was former Fingal resident John Stingle and Matt Kennedy (2.39.86).

As well as recording faster times during the day, very few penalties were incurred by the roofbolting team for torque, bolt projection, safety breaches etc.

COAL SHOVELLING

Local coal shoveller Wayne Miller was unfortunately sidelined this year due to a chest infection. He was on hand, however to coach and encourage the local entrants in all heats of the coal shovelling.

This year saw the re-introduction of team events for children. The eager and eventually dirty youngsters competed for \$100 worth of McDonalds.

The serious business began in the singles coal shovelling. Queenslander Brian McArdle, cleaned up the day winning the singles, the two-man and coming second in the four man events.

Brian's winning time in the single event was 32.97 seconds to shovel a whopping 508kg. Second in the singles event was Heta Heke of Qld (33.91); third Eugene MacKinnon (39.47)

The two man events were taken out by the visiting Queenslanders. Rod Sparkes and Brian McArdle came first with a time of 1.18.81; second, Les Bentlin and a very busy Brian McArdle (1.18.90); third, Heta Heke and Matt Kennedy (1.20.95)

RECORDS TUMBLE AT THE FINGAL FESTIVAL

The Fingal Valley Festival was held in perfect weather on Saturday 28 February, after more than a few worried glances at the cloudy sky early in morning.

Final preparations began early on Saturday and to the amusement of some local youngsters, the "Boy In Blue" in charge of the Crime Stoppers bus locked his keys inside and required the assistance of roofbolting judge Greg Bean and some of his tools to regain entry into the vehicle.

ROOFBOLTING

The World Roofbolting Championships saw the return of the faster "Gopher" roofbolters to the stands and with their reintroduction came hopes that some new world record times would be recorded.

The 1992 world record time of 1.59.11 minutes set by Darren Bean and Tony Ward was smashed by 1997 World and Australian



Champions Jason McGiveron and Rex Floyed in the semi finals with a time of 1.54.64.

The boys carried the hopes of the valley and Tasmania into the grand final. However,

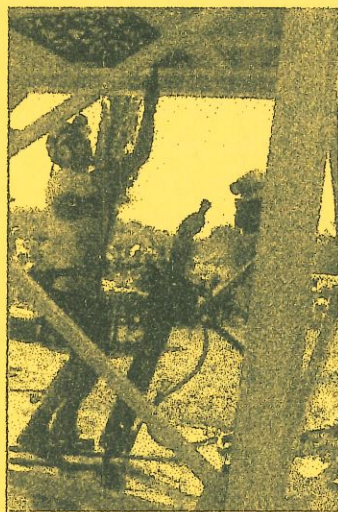
Ox Bryan, Barry Gillies and Andrew Jones came third in this event.

CAMP QUALITY PRESS RELEASE

Our annual Residential Camp was held at Fawltly Towers campsite from the 9th Jan 1998 to 17th Jan 1998.

Fawltly Towers Camp is undoubtedly the premier campsite in Tasmania as it offers a vast range of programme resource to our special children. However, our numbers far exceed the bed space available so tent accommodation and relevant infrastructure is required to house our total numbers. This year our numbers again increased and as a result we trialed a new concept by facilitating two consecutive camps. Camp 1 was set up for our campers 9 years of age and under and ran from 9 - 12th Jan, and Camp 2 was for our campers 10 years and over and ran from 12-17th Jan.

Both camps were extremely successful with the junior age group being able to relax and enjoy a more age specific programme. 1997 RETENTION SURVEY

For your interest, 35 students who successfully completed grade 10 and left St Marys in 1997 are undertaking the following:

- **11 students at the East Coast Vocational Education Centre**
- **12 students at Newstead College**
- **1 at Rosny College**
- **1 at Elizabeth College**
- **2 at TAFE**
- **1 has a traineeship**
- **3 have gained full time work**
- **only one student is not working and/or studying on a full time basis.**

As most of you would no doubt be aware, many changes in education have taken place over the past few years and it is now expected that all grade 10 students will have to complete at least year 11.

From 1 July 1998, all financial assistance for young people will change also. the **Youth Allowance** which applies to all young people under the age of 25 will replace:-

- Austudy and Isolated Children's Allowance for 16 - 24 year olds.
- Newstart allowance for 16 - 20 year olds.
- Youth training Allowance for 16-17 year olds.
- Sickness allowance for 16-20 year olds.
- Family Payment for some secondary students.

Once Youth Allowance starts, young people under 18 will have to be in full time education or training to get financial assistance unless they get a special exemption because they are sick, homeless, or unable to get an appropriate education or training place.

I am hoping to arrange for a representative from Centrelink to run a parent session in the near future to elaborate these changes. I will keep you informed.

It is with the above changes to financial assistance in mind and the variable education training opportunities available, decreased school budgets etc. etc that we have had to evaluate our current retention program. It was decided that grade 9 students will no longer be involved in the City Orientation Camp. Instead, all students in grade 10 and all students studying at the East Coast Vocational Education Centre will undertake City Orientation in the future.

For this year only, because the current grade 10 students undertook city orientation only last December they will attend a Taster Day at Newstead College only. This is usually held during July. All year 11/12 students will be given the opportunity to visit TAFE, Drysdale, Hostels etc for this year as well as attending Taster Day.

All visiting college / hostel staff, defence force visits etc will address grade 9 students and their parents as well.

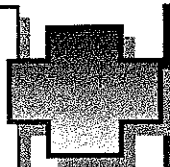
St Helens District High School is continuing their Parents' Trip to Launceston which takes in Launceston and Newstead Colleges, Parkside Hostel, Orana Lodge and Bain Terrace Student Accommodation. This will be held on Wednesday 25 March. Unfortunately St Marys is unable to continue subsidising this trip any longer and will not be hiring a bus. Margaret Osborne from St Helens had kindly offered any spare seats to our parents. If anyone is interested in going, please give me a ring as soon as possible.

Throughout the year there will be various parent information evenings, afternoons that will be held to keep you informed about educational options, financial assistance, accommodation, transport etc. Notice of such happenings is always given to students so please check on a regular basis with your son/daughter or give me a ring if you think they may have missed out.

If you have any questions, queries or concerns regarding education beyond Year 10, please don't hesitate to contact me on **Wednesdays** and the **first and third Tuesday of the month**, or leave a message at the office and I will get back to you as soon as possible.

When wealthy roofing contractor refuses to pay compensation to one of his work men Fatty Lewis after a fall on job site Fatty's twin sons decide to dish out their own pay-back in style. Set in Swansea in Wales this black comedy is raw and compelling with strong language.

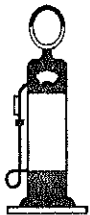
