Jeff has been hard to track down over the past few weeks, but was finally caught up with just a few days before he takes off to Crossing Falls W.A. which is 15 kilometres on the Darwin side of Kununurra and where the dry season temperatures range from 15 degrees at night to 30 degrees during the day. Crossing Falls is of similar size to Falmouth but the blocks are much bigger up there.

He has been busy converting his Daihatsu diesel truck into a "mobile home". The tray has a tarpaulin cover over framework and this will be loaded with building supplies and is Jeff's home for the week it will take him to reach Crossing Falls, 4000 kms away. Jeff's third trip up north is to where he has a 2 acre block with power and water but also has two Boab trees in the yard just in case he runs short of water!. On the canvas is where the "Be alert, Lerts have more fun" message is written, amongst Seaview, St Patricks Head and the surrounding hills all painted on the canvas canopy. Jeff said he could have brolgas, crocodiles and aboriginal art added to his canvas by the time he comes back to St Marys.

Two verandahs with shadecloth are to be added to his Adco building, one for kitchen and outdoor living and the other for sleeping, no windows or doors needed but mosquito nets a very good idea. The six big King Browns live under a sheet of iron on Jeffs block. Fishing the Ord River and exploring the area are on the agenda after the building jobs have been done and will be there for "caller ins".

Jeff assured me that he would be back in town for the Singing Dog and Talking Bird Festival sometime in October.

Many of us would be quite envious of Jeff's lifestyle, summer in St Marys and winter at Crossing Falls WA.



We will be looking forward to hearing about that King Brown Festival Jeff!!.







