# DAVIES WAXFLOWER

**St Marys Junior Landcarers  
in action again!**

*St Marys Junior Landcare has been approached by Matthew Appleby of DELM (no doubt having heard of their stirring efforts for the Swift Parrot) to help with re-establishing the Davies Waxflower.*

*Background; The Davies Waxflower is an endangered species of local shrub struggling to maintain itself in the river valleys and creek beds of the east coast. A very limited and dwindling*

*population exists in this area.*

*Following successful propagation of plants by Temco, Matthew is hoping St Marys students will be keen to assist in the planting out of Davies Waxflowers in suitable sites around the area. Discussions as to the availability of such sites are in progress and we hope to have a major planting on the 1st September, just prior to endangered species week.*

*Again, if your are interested in helping out (probably with the 5\6 students) then please contact Howard at school.*

## CROSS COUNTRY Around the farm.

It was great to see cross country make full use of the school farm. The new courses incorporated a dash through the nitens plantation and along the creek bank for the secondary runners and several fence, stiles and gate scrambles for the primaries. The bales of hay (to aid shorter runners over the gates) provided the only interest the cattle took in the event, as they displayed their normal reticence toward students.

A visiting sheep completed a frantic tour of the lower paddocks for most of the morning before heading back over the creek.

Hopefully the courses will become permanent allowing for times and records to be established as the students become familiar with the course layout.

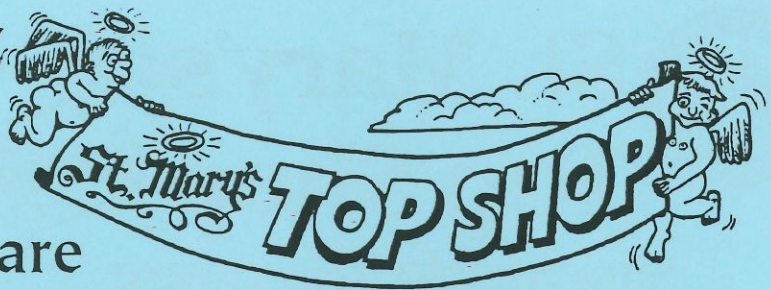

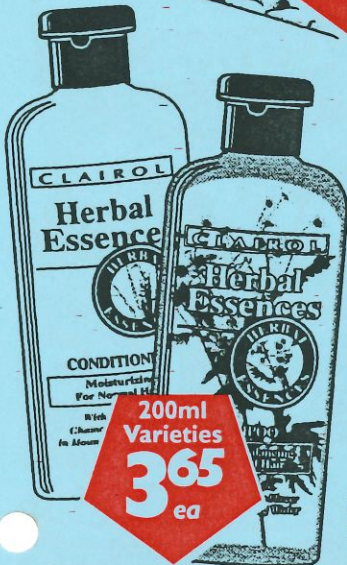

# St Marys early days

**The Valley & East Coast Voice**

## DALMAIN

The Dalmain coal mine was the smallest of the four mines in the St Marys area. It produced good quality coal being part of an extensive coal field. Like the other small mine in the area, Jubilee, Dalmain was mainly run by manual labour and had only one pit pony.

The history of the exploration for coal in the Gray area, 11 kms south east of St Marys, appears to have been a pastime which was begun around 1860. At this time a section of shaley coal was discovered in the upper part of Picaninny Creek, but due to dense vegetation nothing further was done until 1887 when the first mining leases in the area were taken out. With many leases forthcoming it was not until the early 1900's that the Dalmain seams were seriously investigated. In 1914 the Dalmian Collieries Company was floated and by 1915 the main tunnel had been driven 120 metres and plans were underway for the erection of an aerial ropeway running from the mine to Picaninny Point as a means of transporting the coal.

In August 1917, after operating unofficially for several years, the Dalmain mine was officially opened. The areial ropeway had a haulage ca-

capacity of fifty tonnes an hour and once at Picaninny Point the coal

was loaded onto the waiting boats from the 180 metre long jetty.

The promising operations were destined to failure as with the advent of the WW1 it was almost impossible to find suitable boats to transport the coal and the mine closed in 1918.

However, operations commenced again in 1938 with the coal being wheeled to the surface by hand and transported to St Marys by road and then by rail to its destination.

Development to the south of the mine was started and in 1950 a second drive began. This was finished in 1952 and replaced the old main heading which had become unfit for use. For reasons which remain unexplained, the year after these new developments, 1953, the mine was suddenly forced to close down once again. It has remained closed since then although evidence suggests that deposits of coal may still remain.

Unlike the two large mines, Cornwall and Mt Nicholas, Dalmain was similar to the Jubilee Mine in that the miners did not live on site, thus making it easier for the mine to fade from people's memories once the men had left.

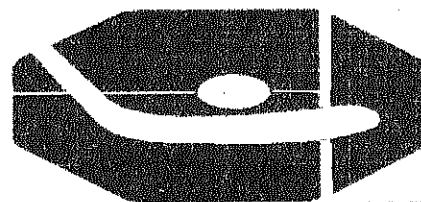

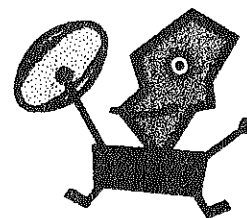

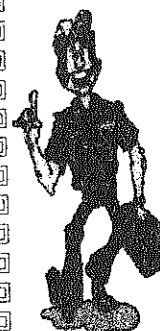

we get a strong and committed committee.

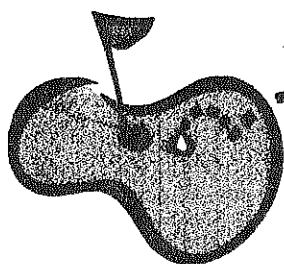
Lastly the next two weeks will see the annual Spilsbury Trophy played.
