Election promise for hospital

The following is from a letter addressed to: Mr Len Miles

St Marys District Hospital Support Group from Premier Jim Bacon MHA

'I remain acutely aware of the need to restore a 24 hour per day hospital and age care service to the St Marys district at the earliest opportunity. As you are aware, I made specific commitment to restore the service as a facility incorporating the present Health Centre and for the facility to be transferred to the not for profit private sector to be administered with local involvement.

The re-establishment of the hospital will involve negotiation with a suitable private operator together with considerable redevelopment of the site and discussions with the Commonwealth. Consequently the re-establishment of the facility will not occur overnight and may not be possible until some time in 1999. However, I wish to emphasize that it will be done.'




