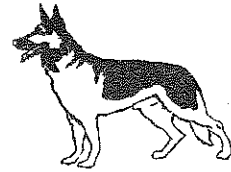

The 150 year old township of St Marys nestles under the distinctive majesty of St Patricks Head. Nearby the hills of the eastern Fingal Valley help encapsulate a closeknit community built from farming and mining.

A closer inspection by the traveller before heading down the incredible St Marys or Elephant Pass to the suncoast will reveal homesteads, churches (old and new), the historic local pub and railway station, as well as the renowned Todds Hall that was once a picture theatre.

PEDESTRIAN SAFETY 10 POINTS FOR SURVIVAL

STOP - before you step onto the road
LOOK - right, left and then check back
to your right again.
LISTEN - for traffic you might not be
able to see.
THINK - safety, make sure you really do
have time to cross the road.
NEVER - assume drivers have seen you
REDUCE - the risk by crossing at a
pedestrian crossing.
IF - the traffic is heavy, be patient.
IF - you walk at night, wear light and
bright coloured clothes.
IF - you have been drinking, remember
your balance and judgement will be
impaired.
AND REMEMBER - SOME PEOPLE
RESPOND TO DANGER MORE
SLOWLY THAN OTHERS.
... and 10 points for drivers
ALWAYS - scan the road and expect the
unexpected.
ALWAYS - approach a pedestrian
crossing at a speed where you can stop.
DRIVE - slowly enough to react to
sudden pedestrian movements.
LOOK OUT - for children around
schools, playgrounds and residential
streets.
BE PATIENT - and give the old and the
young time to cross the road safely.
STOP - when someone is on a marked
crossing or about to cross.
GIVE WAY - to pedestrians when
turning at an intersection.
WATCH OUT - for school signs and
signals from uniformed school crossing
guards and obey them
BEWARE - that most pedestrian
accidents happen mid-block.
BEWARE - of drinkers near pubs, clubs
and other social venues.

SWIMMING POOL KEYS

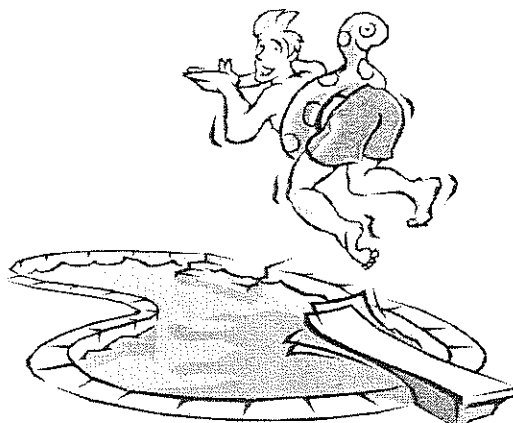
The Swimming Pool will be open for family and community use some time in the first week of November 1998 until mid April 1999. Definite opening date will be advised later.

CD REVIEW – Ozzy Osbourne – “The Ozz man cometh”

Rock has had many heroes , but few are as colourful and interesting as Ozzy Osbourne. In a career spanning the wild days of 70's metal fore runners Black Sabbath ,right through the ever changing 80's solo albums with legendary guitarists such as Randy Rhoads and Zak Wylde Ozzy has remained a god in heavy metal circles.

Everyone who loves rock has their favourite outrageous story to tell about Ozzy. This collection is an excellent way to introduce people unaware of his work as well as the fan who has most of Ozzy's CD's because it not only contains all his hits from the solo years , ' it also has rare early Sabbath demos such as “ War Pigs “,”Fairies wear boots” and “Black Sabbath”. Best tracks are many but gems like “Crazy Train”, “Mr Crowley” and “Bark at the moon” will long be remembered in rock history.

The only criticism I have is the edited version of his finest track ,the 90's classic “No More Tears” , still you get 17 great cuts and a bonus interview disc which is not only informative but also very enlightening to the talents of one of rocks finest .

CD REVIEW – You am I – “You am I's #4 Record” Tim Rogers is without a doubt the best pop song writer in Australia at the moment. He has an uncanny way of putting together lyrics to make them an absolute pleasure to read. This together with catchy melodies and clever hooks borrowed heavily from the 60's are the reasons why You am I are one of the most popular Aussie bands today. This is their 4th CD hence the title and it is their best yet, that's no mean feat considering the brilliance of “Hourly daily” from a few years back. #4 kicks off with “Junk” a typical pub rocker that is getting its share of airplay but the commercial potential of this CD is unlimited with tracks like “What I don't know about you”, “Rumble” and “Billy” have hit stamped all over them. But for mine the highlight is the acoustic ballad “Heavy heart” which Tim Rogers wrote after the break down of his longterm relationship with his girlfriend, it is pure poetry of the 90's. Access:

Turn off the Tasman Highway 1km east of St Marys.

Turn off is signposted. Take the Irishtown Rd for 2.5km and then turn left or north and continue for nearly 1km before parking at the road edge near some old farm buildings.

The Walk:

Walk uphill across paddocks before entering the forest.

The track is well graded as it traverses the southern slopes of Paddys Head, however the grade steepens dramatically to attain the main east-west summit ridge. The track then continues west along this ridge until, with the help of a fixed metal ladder, the trig. point is reached. The summit offers superb views along the coast and west to the Nicholas Range and Fingal Valley.

Walking time:

1½ hours return. The track is well marked, but children would need to be closely supervised, particularly on the summit edge.
