



CHRISTMAS BISCUIT SLICE

BASE

125g butter

1/4 cup castor sugar

½ teaspoon vanilla

11/4 cups plain flour

TOPPING

125g dates

125g glace pineapple

60g apricots

60g green cherries

60g red cherries

125g brazil nuts

1 egg

1/4 cup brown sugar

½ teaspoon vanilla

45g butter

2 tablespoons plain flour

1 tablespoon self-raising flour

60g dark cooking chocolate, chopped

2 teaspoons butter

BASE: Beat butter and sugar well, add vanilla. Add sifted flour, mix well. Knead on lightly floured board. Place in greased 18cm x 28cm tin. Press evenly.

TOPPING: Chop dates, pineapple and apricots into large pieces. Halve cherries Beat egg, add sugar and and nuts. Add softened vanilla and beat well. butter, stir in sifted flours. Add fruit and nuts to creamed mixture. Spread over Bake at 160C 40-45 biscuit base. minutes until lightly browned. Remove from over. With knife loosen around edges, but allow to cool in tin. Melt chopped chocolate and butter over hot water. Drizzle over topping. Cut into fingers

Extracts from the "Will you survive" pamphlet

Planning is the Key to Bushfire survival.

Your risk of losing life and property during a bushfire is affected by many factors- The location and accessibility of your property, the amount and type of surrounding vegetation, the condition and placement of buildings, the availability of water, and the physical capabilities of you and your family. Every home is different. That's why every family needs to develop an individual plan.

Consider these points:

- Safety of children, elderly or handicapped members of the household
- Your own physical and mental capability to cope with a major fire
- Whether or not your home can be safely defended (is fuel reduction work properly maintained, are water supplies sufficient)

The first and most important decision you must make is whether or not you plan to stay with your home. Homes occupied by able bodied residents are more likely to survive, because small outbreaks on the structure can be extinguished quickly by the occupants. (The fire service cant be everywhere at once.)

If you decide to evacuate, you must plan to do so early, well before the fires reach your vicinity. Lives are most often lost during unplanned last-minute evacuations.

Houses usually ignite from small sparks and embers collecting in crevices or blowing into long grass or dead leaves on or near the house structure. By maintaining your home carefully and removing dead, dry vegetation, you reduce the possibilities of your house igniting.

You can expect strong winds and heavy smoke causing reduced visibility, in addition the fire will generate a very load noise which may be traumatic.

- Follow your plan.
- Stay with your home if that is the decision you have made
- Wear appropriate dress (Long sleeve shirt, long pants and sturdy leather foot wear)
- Inside, windows are a weak point. Remove curtains and all furniture away from windows. Fill the bath and all available water containers (sink, buckets, etc). Block crevices with wet towels.
- You will need to continually patrol the inside of your house during the peak period when the fire passes, to check for ignition points.
- Retreat indoors as the fire front approaches or when the radiant heat gets too great.
- Inspect as soon as possible after the front has passed for spot fires. (Inside and out)
- Patrol your home, it will need to be under constant surveillance for three to four hours after the fire has passed.
- Remember to drink plenty of fluids.

GAMES REVIEW -"FINAL FANTASY V11" Playstation; You play the character Cloud Strife a cold hearted mercenary who takes missions purely for monetary gain. An ex-soldier who joins a rebel gang to stop the Shinra Corp from draining the planet of its life forces. I've been playing the game for a couple of days and still I'm undecided whether it's worth finishing or not. FFV11 is a classic roll playing game right down to the old style of battle -each opponent takes a turn and battle moves are not in real time as with most newer games. Being 3 CD's long there are many video cut scenes and they tend to go on far too long, speech is limited to text bubbles (very disappointing) game play can be repetitive. On the positive side FFV11 is artistically a beautiful game with rich backgrounds and a reasonable amount of freedom of movement. This game received absolute rave reviews in all playstation mags and so I'll persevere. ***

CD REVIEW – Ricky Martin "VUELVE" - Contains the hits such as "Cup of Life", "Maria" and "La Bomba". If you like those above you'll love this album. It's solid Latin rhythms and hardly and English word in sight. Ricky Martin is probably the flavour of the moment but will fade quickly from the charts, but for now "Vuelve" is a refreshing change from the usual. Production could have been better as a lot of the tracks sounds slightly muddy and don't accentuate the rhythm. ***

CD REVIEW - Catatonia - "INTERNATIONAL VEL-VET" - Hailing from Wales in Great Britain Catatonia have been getting some much deserved airplay with their singles "Mulder and Scully" and "Road Rage". The rest of the CD comprises of quirky pop songs and strange acoustic pieces the new single "I am the Mob" although not as clever as the previous two is also being picked up by radio. Good vocals, clever pop writing and reasonable musicianship make "International Velvet" a good commercial CD. ****

VIDEO REVIEW - "PRIMARY COLOURS"

Starring John Travolta, Emma Thompson, Billy-bob Thornton and Kathy Bates. Travolta plays a very Clintonesque President of the USA, the video depicts the rise to fame of the President from his title of Senator of a small southern state to the night of his election. As usual with Travolta's later parts he is proving to be an actor of good substance far removed from his Saturday Night Fever days. Emma Thompson puts in a fine performance as his long suffering wife, Billy-Bob Thornton is excellent as the President's Mr fixit. When the heat comes down the President calls on an old reliable trouble-shooter and ex-secretary played by Kathy Bates, she is brilliant as the head kicking lesbian from the South. As an adult drama Primary Colours stands up well with a fine cast an interesting story pertinent to current events it's well worth a look. ****
