# Results beginning to be seen around town.

St Marys Town Theme Committee

At it's monthly meeting on 2nd March '99 the Committee noted the completion of the 'Linden Walk' project, comprising the replacement of the Main Street bridge railings, the construction of the footpath from the bridge to The Flat and the planting of an avenue of trees along the footpath:

Further work scheduled or under consideration in this area of town include removal of the HEC pole at the bridge and undergrounding power to the BBQ and toilets, construction of a river crossing to the Sight and Sound Playground area, and development of 'Wombat Walk'.

Estimates and a preliminary design for an off street car park development at the Memorial Hall were considered, and a recommendation made to Council that the project proceed immediately.

An Architect design is to be obtained for the front of the Hall to incorporate better porch facilities against rain.

The street level on the south side of Main Street between the Post Office and Cameron Street is to be altered to eliminate the high step up from the street to the pavement.

At it's April meeting, Committee will consider preliminary designs for a series of historical plaques to be located along the Oak Tree Walk between Cameron and Frank Streets, to mark significant dates in the settlement of St Marys, such as the naming of St Patricks Head, the construction of St Marys Pass, the gazettal of St Marys as a town, the discovery of coal, the opening of the railway, the building of Elephant Pass etc.

Consideration is also to be given to the issue of the design and location of street furniture within the town, such as bins, benches and tables.

At a previous meeting, in response to a request from Council Officers for the advice of the Committee, it was recommended to Council that a second public toilet, with facilities for disabled people, car parking and landscaping be established at the western end of town opposite Newman's Takeaway, on the corner of Main and Cameron Streets.

The Committee meets monthly and welcomes any suggestions for the improvement and development of the streetscape in St Marys in respect of appearance, safety, interest, convenience and facilities.

Current members are Mayor Robert Legge, General Manager John Brown, Clr. Debra Manskey, Jim Napier, Grant Faulkner, Mary Targett, David Clement and Brent Johnson, with Works Manager Trevor Berriman in attendance.

# New water supply soon on line.

Much activity has been seen at the top end of Cameron Street St Marys over recent months, Council men and machinery have been working to ensure that the scheme is on schedule. Due to inherent problems with above ground water, investigations were undertaken to confirm quality and quantity of the bore water.

The bore water is of very good bacterial quality but has a high mineral content, specifically iron and manganese.

A trial "treatment" process involving aeration was undertaken which successfully removed the iron and manganese and showed that the water was treatable with a good end product resulting.

Following this, Council resolved to call tenders for a complete treatment plant and this was awarded to TEMA Engineers, Sydney in November 1998.

This plant has now been installed at the top of Cameron Street and is currently being plumbed by the contractor ready for a scheduled start of 19th March 1999.

The plant basically consists of a sand filter through which the water passes and the iron and manganese is extracted.

The treated water flows through to town and the waste water flows to a lagoon where the concentrated iron and manganese settles out. The clear water from the lagoon then flows

overland to a watercourse.

The system is a very simple/basic one and will result in a high quality water.

At this stage there is no intention of post chlorination as the bacterial quality is high. There is a pre chlorination injection for oxidisation, which assists in the removal of the iron, this is removed during the filtering process.

- 1. Council consider in the next Budget the replacement of the footpath on the south side of Main Street from the Top Shop to Newman Street with grey pavers to a width of 1.5m.
  (12 January 1999)
- 2. Council to establish off street car parking in St Marys as a matter of urgency. (8 February 1999).
- 3. Due to it's degraded condition, the footpath along the eastern side of Storey Street (the Hotel to the Church) be upgraded as a matter of priority as part of the Council Works programme. (8 February 1999)

The prime objective of the night is to get all heads together to formulate the ongoing survival of the club in such difficult economic circumstances of the moment.




