Cornwall playground equipment

The equipment at the Cornwall playground was recently removed by the Break O'Day Council due to safety reasons. Following a recent incident involving a child, Council Officers inspected the playground equipment and found that the equipment was defective and unsafe in a number of ways.

- * Swing seats were broken and chains hanging.
- * Balancing beam structure has been used to lift car engines and had numerous finger/hand traps.
- * Slide had sharp protruding edges capable of cutting, plus was over 2 meters high with no rails.
- * There was no softfall material under any of the equipment, material was concrete.

The Council has a duty of care to ensure that danger such as the above is minimised and had no alternative but to remove the equipment. Council's Works Manager is preparing an estimate to replace the equipment for the Council to consider at the upcoming budget sessions.

Big improvement in water

Extract from The Examiner 14 September 1892

St Marys

It was agreed some time ago to plant some trees along the main street, which was done accordingly by three members of the Improvement Association; but it was discovered after they were planted that, instead of being in a straight line, they were zigzag.

However they are now straightened, and in a fair way of becoming an ornament to the township in future.

The Association are certainly deserving of thanks for their efforts in the way of improvement.

The Farmer's Club still continues to do good work in a small way. Farmers are beginning now to see the advantage of such an institution.

General approval is expected at the action of the Fingal Municipal Council deciding to erect new police buildings at St Marys, the present buildings being lamentably insufficient for requirements.

With just a few days to go till our South Australian visitors arrive here, I thought a little information about the team leader would be appropriate.

Neil Brenton Piller, an Australian who lives at Upper Sturt South Australia.

Currently Associate Professor and Course Coordinator Msc (PHC) with the Department of Public Health, School of Medicine at Flinders University. Team Leader of the Lymphoedema Assessment Clinic, Flinders Oncology Unit at Flinders Medical Centre.

Professor Piller says "I've got a very strong on going commitment to improving the knowledge base of all health professionals (including the Surgeons, Medical and radiation Oncologists) and to those at risk of lymphoedema and to those already with it.

For those at risk I hope to try to show people how the risk can be reduced - there are patient controllable risk factors!

For those with lymphoedema I try to show them how to reduce the severity of their problem. All this can be done through the provision of a short informative education and awareness program. This offers power to the patient and to their partner and or carer."

Professor Neil Piller will be speaker at the St Marys Community Health Centre this weekend

STUDY LEAVE: Professor N.B. Piller

1995: Three months visiting various laboratories in Germany, Italy, Holland and Austria, with the aim being to observe new techniques associated with lymphoedema and lipoedema treatment. Also spent 6 weeks in the lymphoedema rehabilitation unit, Red Cross Hospital Stockholm where conducted follow up studies in previously initiated trials and developed a new instrument for determining changes in limb mass and density subsequent to treatment.

1991: Three months in Stockholm, Sweden in the Lymphoedema Rehabilitation Unit, Karolinski Red Cross Hospital where I organised and managed a number of short term clinical trials comparing the efficacy of a range of lymphogenic and lymphostimulatory type of conservative therapies.

1988: Six months in Xian, China. Mostly at the Shaanxi Teachers University where I taught English composition and grammar to 2nd and 4th Year students as well as investigating the traditional Chinese conservative therapies for the treatment of lymphoedemas. The teaching experience has helped me in my approach to teaching students with different ethnic backgrounds.

1983: Six months spent in a number of European Lymphological laboratories, but mostly in Department of Plastic and reconstructive Surgery, Kantonsspital, Zurich, Switzerland. Studied and developed models of lymphoedema and investigated forms of conservative lymphoedema treatment.

Plus some 250 research papers, articles and presentations on the topic of Lymphoedema.

Next issue a little about the life and work of the three Physios coming with Neil.

Ann armed with her lazer beams and Robyn with her magic fingers, also Ria, all the way from the U.S.A.

Playstation Games Review

Need For Speed 4 - High Stakes

If you like me and enjoyed NFS 3 immensely then the release of this little gem will delight. The first two games in the series that just keeps getting better were a sloppy effort on Sony's part to cash in on the success of the classic PC title, but with bad road control and lack of excitement they just didn't cut it. When Gran Turismo came on the scene all the game designers were forced to take the graphic power and gameplay to the next level, but where as GT is a little daunting and complicated Need For Speed 4 is just pure driving sim pleasure. You get the choice of the usual racing and time trials with or without the police on your tail, but traffic is an option and also you can be the police pursuing your friends in two player mode or the computer in one.
