Rat Poison in St Marys Water

St Marys water is generating comments from all quarters. But while most residents are pointing the finger at the Break O'Day Council about problems arising from the recent connection to bore water and the operation of the new water treatment plant, the Department of Primary Industry is quietly preparing to dump rat poison into the water supply on a daily basis.

Hopefully, the problems of taste, smell, staining, etc. arising from the new connection are short term teething problems. Even if they are more fundamental, they can be resolved at the local level by our local Council acting on behalf and listening to our concerns. A Public Meeting of all people connected to the system would not go amiss, with Councillors and Council Officers attending, so that the owners of the water supply, the residents, can be fully informed about the current situation and make their views known. I am sure that Council's Mission Statement must say something about

"community participation", "partnership", "ownership", "transparent decision making" and the like, and that all Councillors are in favour of an informed electorate. They were at the last election, anyway. We could replace the mushroom as our logo with an open book.

However, for some years past, the State Government has been adding fluoride on a daily basis to our water supply, without any reference to either the Council or the residents who drink it. Council is required by the Waterworks Clauses Act 1952 to "keep in the pipes laid down by them a supply of pure and wholesome water." However, the Department of Health and the State Fluoridation Committee use the DPI each day to add fluoride, a scheduled poison, to the water, and Council has no say in the matter. At present, fluoride is not being added, while DPI could add fluoride shed at the water plant, but it will be unless residents get it stopped until we have the opportunity to discuss the issue with the Fluoridation Committee.

The following quotes are from the web page of the DPI (www.dpif.tas.gov.au/domino/dpif/L).

"Fluoride was used as a rat poison in the past"

"Fluoride does not treat or cure anything"

In Natick, Massachusetts, the Water Rate Notice states that pregnant women and parents of children under three should consult their doctor before drinking their fluoridated water. Six months ago, Water UK, the controlling body of water supply authorities in the UK told the Government they did not want to fluoridate water supplied anymore unless the residents voted to do so, to avoid legal responsibility for damage to people's health. The Chief Executive Officer said, "the people drink it, they should have the say what's in it."

Ken Bacon and Michael Polley, as members for Lyons, have made submissions to David Llewellyn as Minister for Primary Industry. It has been asked to hold off from re-introducing fluoride into the water until people from St Marys can attend a meeting with the Fluoridation Committee. As Ken Bacon said in his submission, "whether fluoride in the water is good or bad is not the issue. I support the residents of St Marys in their claim that they have a right to be consulted and put their position on fluoride before any Government section". Now that's "community participation"!

ST MARYS IN TIMES GONE BY CONT.

Tourists have so great a diversity of drives and walks to places of note to choose from, affording so many facilities for the admiration of nature's wonders that the interest never flags. Of these may be mentioned St Marys Pass, driving to St Helens the road leads through this pass. The road was engineered by Governor Denison and made by prison labour. On leaving St Marys a short, natural avenue of towering gum trees is padded through and emerging the road then for about two miles has dotted on either side here and there neat cottage of selectors. The clearings around announce the struggle that is going on between man and the forest.

On reaching the top of the road, almost without warning the pass is entered and the magnificent gorge stretches to the ocean in picturesque grandeur. Down through the trees hundreds of feet below glistens a tiny stream, tumbling over the side of the hill a waterfall leaps and rushes and away towards the ocean are the rollers breaking over the black rocks in white foam. The road now winds along mountain side in an easy descent, sometimes under overhanging cliffs and then skirting along the edges of precipices. The beautiful native shrubs and flowers add enchantment to the scene, and the thick clustering clematis in profusion diffuse sweet fragrance through the cool zephyrs wafted from the sea. The immense forest of the gorge include ironbark, gums, stringy bark, native cherry and sassafras.

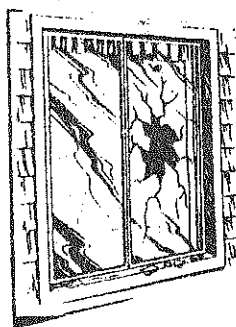

VIDEO REVIEW – “The Spanish Prisoner” Starring Ben Gazzara and Steve Martin

Joe Ross invents a “process” for the company he works for which will monopolize their market share, but when doubts about trust in Joe’s mind lead to fruition it’s already too late. Who to believe, who to trust, this movie is an absolute maze of deceit. The detail of the plot is intricate and well constructed, you will constantly find yourself baffled and delighted as it twists just when you think you’ve got a handle on it. Ben Gazzara plays a dead pan almost cold lead as the trusting Joe Ross, a man who unwittingly jumped into the middle of a rollercoaster of people and places that are far from what they seem.

Not since “The Usual Suspects” have I seen a more enjoyable, astounding movie as “The Spanish Prisoner”. If you enjoy twisted tales of deceit that leave you in complete awe then definitely watch this.

PlayStation Review – “Ridge Racer Type 4”

What is it about the original Ridge Racer that warrants the often touted tag “classic”. Well the first three versions are definitely not spectacular to look at, the long term gameplay is not there being as you basically have just one track that gets added onto as you progress, but they still kept you coming back for moreuntil now. Ridge Racer Type 4 has brought all the good elements of the original titles into a state of the art arcade driving game. It is stunning from the opening full motion video through to the detailed but not over done car setup and into game play that is everything a great arcade racer should be. The cars feel smooth and responsive somewhat like Need For Speed 3 & 4, but still retain that classic Ridge Racer slide/powerout feature. On the minus side the cars and companies are made up which is a shame for lovers of authenticity, but still if you like an arcade driving game with excellent graphics and tons of gameplay, you’d be hard pressed going past Ridge Racer Type 4. ****

PlayStation Review – “Kensai – Sacred Fist”

Sacred Fist is a Tekken type fighting game from Konami, the people who brought us the brilliant “Metal Gear Solid”, so it should be something every fan of the fighting genre would be waiting for. The regular customers of the St Marys Laundromat have been very impressed with the cleanliness of the building and its machinery since it has been under new management - my congratulations to the proprietors! However it is disappointing to also notice that the new proprietors have chosen to limit the wash options available in their machines. Previously, cold, warm and hot washes were offered. This "cold wash only" policy was made several weeks before the Laundromat customers were ever advised!

Sadly I, like many others, will no longer be using the facilities at the Laundromat simply because

•The cold water in St Marys does not dissolve the washing detergent properly (leaving it on the clothes) and also

•Heavily soiled clothes cannot be cleaned satisfactorily in cold water. Some people cannot afford the luxury of a washing machine and others have to use this Laundromat service because they are on tank water at home especially those residents living down the coast. I am wondering when the proprietors are going to alter their price to accommodate this change. I feel \$2 per load for a cold wash is overpriced. Just another example of services again being cut in St Marys with little consultation. When is it going to stop?

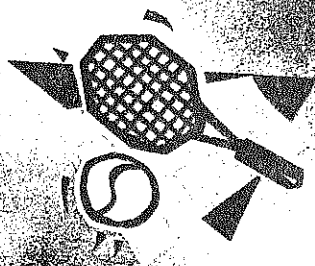
St Marys Pacing Club

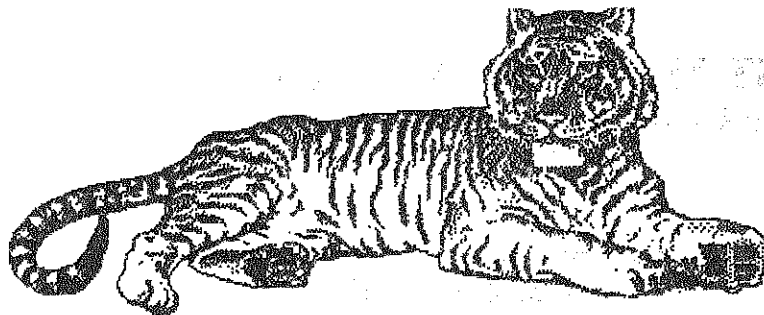

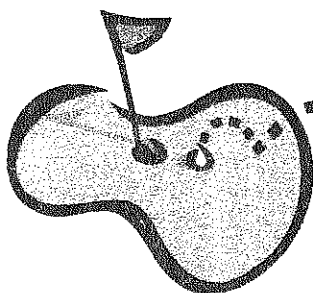

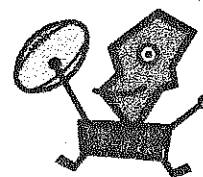
