## Chemical Genocide? *From Exposure Vol 6 No 1, 1999*

**C**ities dump all kinds of toxic substances into the water supply in the name of "protecting the public." Chlorine is one of them, and it serves to help rid the water of bacteria and parasites. But the most dangerous, by far, is fluoride. In the United States there is a nationwide debate on fluoride right now, and as with Y2K, the truth is being covered up! Through more than 40 studies, fluoride has been linked to all the following:

- ⇒ Exposure disrupts the synthesis of collagen and leads to the breakdown of collagen in bone, tendon, muscle, skin, cartilage, lungs, kidney and trachea.
- ⇒ Stimulates granule formation and oxygen consumption in white blood cells, but inhibits these processes when the white blood cell is challenged by a foreign agent in the blood.
- ⇒ Depletes the energy reserves and the ability of white blood cells to properly destroy foreign agents by the process of phagocytosis. Even micro-molar amounts of fluoride, below 1 ppm, may seriously depress the ability of white blood cells to destroy pathogenic agents.
- ⇒ Confuses the immune system, and causes it to attack the body's own tissues, and increases the tumour growth rate in cancer-prone individuals.
- ⇒ Inhibits antibody formation in the blood.
- ⇒ Depresses thyroid activity.
- ⇒ Fluoride promotes development of bone cancer.
- ⇒ Causes premature aging of the human body.
- ⇒ Ingestion from mouth rinses and dentifrices in children is extremely hazardous to biological development, life span and general health.
- ⇒ The contents of a family size tube of fluoridated toothpaste is enough to kill a 25 pound child.
- ⇒ Is medically categorised as protoplasmic poisons, which is why it is used to kill rodents.
- ⇒ has little or no effect on decay prevention in humans.

- ⇒ No scientific data shows that fluoride mouth rinses and tablets are safe for human use.
- ⇒ The fact that fluoride toothpastes and school based mouth rinses are packaged in aluminium accentuates the effect on the body.

## Fluoride & Y2K

**B**ecause fluoride is so toxic, and it can literally kill people in very small quantities, it must be metered into the city water supplies at a parts-per-million dosage. Many cities use a 1ppm dose, which is a very small ratio. To accomplish this, fluoride tanks are equipped with computers that monitor the time, then dump a drop of poison fluoride into the water flow when the appropriate amount of time has elapsed. This process is based on a time-sensitive embedded system, and all such fluoride metering systems may not be Y2K compliant. If fluoride metering device rolled over to "00", it is possible that it might incorrectly calculate the elapsed time as being 100 years, thereby releasing 100 years of fluoride directly into the water supply.

### Fluoride & Y2K

People who drink the water would literally drop dead from fluoride poisoning, suffering the exact same fate as the rats and mice that have ingested fluoride over the years, because fluoride was for a long time the main ingredient in "rat poison." (and it works.)

You'd be foolish to drink city water straight after the Year 2000 rollover. How do you know whether the water contains a fatal dose of fluoride or other chemicals? Just to be safe, avoid drinking city water for at least 24 hours, then watch the news to see if people are "mysteriously" dropping dead.

If they are, stick to your bottled water and watch as the city goes nuts trying to find some kind of virus or bacteria responsible for the deaths. 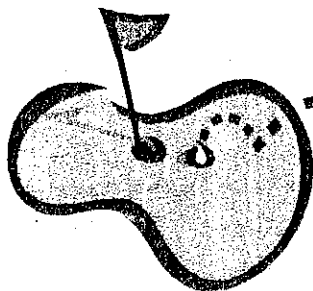
## ST MARYS SPORTS CENTRE

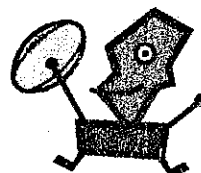
