The Antenna Farm On Irish Town Road? By Barb Hagger.

Ever wondered what those antennas surrounding the Aulich house on Irish Town Road are all about? Have you noticed a few extra tourist vehicles passing through town with large aerials on the bull bar, looking for the Aulich household of St Marys Base?

I wonder how many of you know that Michael, Gerald and Wendy Aulich speak to people all over Australia every night of the week?

In addition to all else that happens there, their house in Irish Town Road is the **Tasmanian Base** of the **Australian National 4WD Radio Network**, **VKS 737.** The network is a charitable organisation, run by volunteers, that provide HF (High Frequency) radio communication and emergency support for travelers, particularly those traveling in the Outback and remote areas.

Origionally begun for 4 wheel drivers, the Network is now open to all owners of HF radios.

Membership numbers over 2800 ordinary and 500 Emergency Service Members, and is growing all the time.

There are bases throughout Australia, including Adelaide, Alice Springs, Perth, Sandstone (WA), Cairns, Derby, Newcastle and here in St Marys.

The Network provides a number of services to members. These include daily weather and road reports for the whole country, extremely important to those traveling in remote areas. Often roads are closed and alternate routes must be found. All bases have the facility for members to call in at any time, and a number of bases have daily voice call schedules, a time for members to report their positions. Family and friends are able to call in to bases and receive regular updates and to contact members

incase of emergency. Members can then contact family if necessary via a telephone linkup through

the base. Bases and members have been instrumental in assisting in many emergency situations throughout the country.

There may be vehicle breakdowns or as in a number of cases, serious accidents. Rescues may be co-ordinated by a Base or member in a distant part of Australia as in a recent case where St Marys Base was able to facilitate the retrieval of a vehicle which had slipped off the road in the Victorian High Country.

In a number of cases members have called in for assistance for other travellers in difficulty. Spare parts and mechanics have arrived at many remote localities, including the Canning Stock Route, following a call for help.

In addition to all this members can talk to each other via their radios as they travel, giving them a great group of friends out there.

Most of us who travel in Tassie end up here in St Marys Base for a "cuppa" or the extended hospitality offered by the Aulich family.

You guessed it, all those aerials on the "Antenna Farm" are part of the radio set-up that burbles away in the corner of the living room and bursts into life every evening at the "sched" time or whenever members want a "chat" or have a challenge. Barbara Hagger



DUNG HELPS EVOLUTION ALONG

A ZOOKEEPER killed by elephant dung has won this year's Darwin Award. The 46-year-old German fed a constipated elephant called Stefan 22 doses of animal laxative and more than a bushel of berries, figs and prunes. Police investigators said the keeper eventually succeeded in giving the beast relief with an olive oil enema. Unfortunately, the "sheer force of the elephant's unexpected defecation knocked him to the ground, where he struck his head on a rock," detective Erik Dern said. "With no one there to help him, he lay under all the dung for at least an hour... and during that time he suffocated." The Darwin Award is given to the person judged to have died in the most unusual circumstances. Believe it or not!



CARELINK

- making it easier to care for St. Marys' aged -

St Marys will become part of a network of 54 Commonwealth Carelink Centres throughout Australia, providing a single point of contact for the benefit of older Australians as part of a major new aged care initiative.

The service will be run by Family Based, Care Assoc. (North) Inc and based in Launceston with satellites at St Marys, Scottsdale and St Helens.

The Federal Government has allocated \$32.8 million to the 54 services for a period of three years, with more than \$500,000 for Northern Tasmanian Services.

Tasmanian Liberal Senator Jocelyn Newman said the centres would enable health professionals. general practitioners, other service providers, carers and individuals to gain easy access to the whole range of agencies providing community care services within the Carelink regions through a central point of contact.

"The new centres will provide information on services available in the region, how to contact them, eligibility criteria, and information relating to fees associated with receiving services," Senator Newman said.

She said the Commonwealth Carelink initiative was evidence of the Commonwealth Government's commitment to assisting people to live at home with appropriate care and support..

Centres will be connected nationally by a 1800 telephone number and a shop front in each region. This will result in a nationwide network of centres offering a service focused on the individual, and making access to services simpler. Centres are expected to be operating by the end of the year.

The establishment of the Commonwealth Carelink Centres will greatly improve access to community care services, including Community Aged Care Packages and Home and Community Care. This will result in improved service delivery, particularly for people needing packages of community care. Carelink regions coincide with established Home and Community Care regions.

BREAK O'DAY COUNCIL St Marys Doctor Update

Efforts to find a Locum have not been successful to date, and the urgency of the situation is being stressed to the Department of Health and Human Services.

The possibility of a Locum through River Medical Services is also being pursued as an alternative.

As advised in the last update contact had been received from a couple of Doctors interested in coming to St Marys to practice. We have now received 2 Resumes which have been forwarded to the Tasmanian GP Division for their assessment of suitability and a response is awaited. Both Doctors would be in a similar situation in terms of a restricted Registration and will need to be approved by the Medical Council.

Discussions have occurred with River Medical Service and they are presently preparing a proposal for the provision of a service based at the St Marys Community Health Centre. The Bicheno and Swansea services both involve River Medical Service. The costs of each service are approximately \$40,000 per annum. \$20,000 charge is met by the State Government, the Glamorgan-Spring Bay Council meets the costs of a fully furnished suitable house, motor vehicle and surgery, again approximately \$20,000 per annum. A Special Rate is charged against each property in a defined area of \$16 per annum.

The Council at its meeting on Monday 11th September decided that if a solution had not been found within 2 weeks it would hold a Special Meeting to consider options such as River Medical Service.


