Have you photographs of St Marys?


Do you have a photograph of the streets or buildings of St Marys taken between 1890 - 1950?

Plans for avenue of Oaks

The St Marys Townscape Development Committee has recommended to Break O'Day Council that an avenue of Pin Oaks (Quercus Palustris) be planted along the 500 metres before the Railway Station.

A proposed design for a town name sign to be erected at each entrance to the town has been submitted for costing. The design shows St Patricks Head, hills and a river with the wording 'ST MARYS 1857, Town of the Eastern Highlands and Break O'Day Plains'.

Erection of the Tourist Information Bay at the intersection of the Esk Highway and Storey Street is underway comprising of a central module with tourist information, covered by a colourbond roof supported by wooden posts. The facia on the four sides will read - St Marys 1857, St Patricks Head 1773, St Marys Pass 1842-1845, Elephant Pass 1888.

Development of the toilets and BBQ at Lions Park is nearing completion, with painting underway. Planning for underground lighting at the Park will be finalised at the March Meeting of the Committee.

Following a meeting of about 50 people concerned about the movement towards clear felling bush and establishing single species tree plantations around St Marys, an action group has been established under the name STOP - 'St Marys Totally Opposed to Plantations'.





What he did for my my parents at the times of their illness, as he also did with my uncles as well, shows his great caring nature and compassion.


I am absolutely certain that hundreds of other Valley and Coast residents will be able to verify his work as a priest and mate. Our thoughts are with him at this time.

Letter to the Editor

Re: 'More hands on'

Firstly let me thank Mr Rodney B McGiveron, for his comments on how SMACD is operating currently. I have taken his comments on board and given them the thought that they deserve.

I would like to refute what Mr McGiveron wrote and inform him of what we, SMACD have done and are currently looking at for St Marys.

Firstly we must now realise that St Marys is seen in many circles as a town that does not take **no** for an answer, and we constantly have enquiries on 'How to' do different projects and support in general.

Without hands on from SMACD, St Marys would be without a banking chamber, which SMACD secured with funding from the Federal Government to maintain facilities in St Marys.

St Marys would also be without an Online Access Centre, Mobile Online Access Centre and many other facilities that we fought long and hard for. In reference to the Markets, they are up and running, all that is needed now is for more community support. We also applied to have a Community garden, Business incubator and SMACD was initially involved with the Catholic Education for the Child Care facility.

I agree with the comment that we are lacking something and I wish to inform the community why this is so. It is very hard to commence and maintain other projects when we have trouble getting people to meetings and getting people to help. There is only a handful of registered members and when it comes down to doing things the responsibility ends up on the shoulder of the few who will work.

If the knockers of SMACD would come and discuss their issues with us instead of making unqualified statements then we would be better informed on what these people want and the discussions could commence to find a way of fixing the problem.

SMACD has brought over \$150,000 into St Marys through different projects in the past 18 months. This is money and assets that St Marys owns, which isn't too bad for a town this size to be able to get monies coming in to enhance all facets of life in rural Tasmania.

I would like to personally encourage any person with any concerns that they may have with how SMACD is operating, to discuss them with me and I assure you that I will do my utmost to help and assist them with their problem.

Finding out the truth is better than going off half cocked.




