Quick apprehension

A burglary and stealing was committed at a St Helens liquor shop where a large amount of alcohol was stolen. This was at about 6.15am last Friday and the offenders were apprehended later the same day with most of the stolen property still in their possession. The responsible persons (not locals) have been charged and will later appear in court.

Vehicles bombing around our area continue to be a problem. There are between three and four cars being driven by youths (most of you should know who they are) which speed, do 'wheelies' and generally cause a nuisance. People who wish to complain about this matter need to take it a little further. This means getting together with your neighbours and making a detailed statement to me about what you see, so that I can initiate court proceedings against offenders.

As the community can appreciate, I am the only officer in the town at the moment, and fortunately for the offenders, I do not work 24 hours a day and 7 days a week. Therefore, I emphasise the fact that the community need to help to police itself by the simple actions as I have already described. If everyone chips in and does their little bit, the offenders in the town will not have a chance.

Know your neighbour .. No 3

Recently spotted sunning itself in a garden along Gray Rd was 'Hypolimnas bolina nerina' - a velvety deep blue-black butterfly with white rippling along the wing margins. The latin name is more attractive than the English appellation of 'Common Eggfly' which downgrades a beautiful insect.

The one in question was a male, identified by the conspicuous white oval spot ringed with rich iridescent blue on the upper side of each wing, with a wing span of about 75mm. The female is bigger with orange patches and white patches of odd shapes and sizes on the upper wing.

The favourite haunts of the male are small sun drenched clearings surrounded by vegetation. It likes to sun itself on a leaf and from time to time take a brisk flight round and round inside a circle of shrubs and then settle again. Exciting, eh?

A delightful creature, it often settles on the head, hand or body of the observer without apparently realising the difference between a human being and a bush, which says something either about the human being or the butterfly.

Anyway, say 'G'day' to 'Hypo' when you see him.






