Science

Task: Catch and lift an ice cube without tying a knot or touching the cube.

You will need - salt
- ice cubes
- thick thread

Method:

1. Soak thread in water and lay it on top of ice cube
2. Sprinkle some salt along the thread. Wait for about 30 seconds
3. Lift the thread.



OBSERVATION AND EXPLANATION

When you lift up the thread the ice cube was stuck to it for a few minutes.

WHY?

When you sprinkle the salt on the cube it melted the surface of the ice. The salt mixed into the water. The coldness of the ice cube made the salty water freeze again, holding the thread in place.

The Planning Scheme

The Break O'Day Planning Scheme 1996 contains a Residential Development Code, intended to "provide guidelines to persons wishing to undertake residential development within the Scheme Area".
