Radio Station another step closer

The Break O'Day FM Radio Station came one step closer to being a reality thanks to a working bee at the weekend. Don Ives, Warren Speers, Mick Suter, Mario Pauls and Robert Barnes carried gear up the steep climb of South Sister to install a tilting tower and the transmitter cabinet.

Two transmitter sites will cover the Break O'Day Municipality and beyond, and hopefully will eventually include Avoca, Rossarden, Bicheno and parts of Swansea.

The frequency for South Sister will be 100.3 mhz and Flagstaff Hill 93.7mhz.

The Studio in Pendrigh Place St Helens is still being fitted out and as yet no date has been set for transmission but hopefully in the new year.

A few holiday reminders

- ◆ It is that time of the year when holidays means more people on the streets and even more on the roads. A friendly reminder and timely warning to local motorists that the blue and red lights will be out in force over the summer break, particularly in our area.
- With the level of vandalism occurring in the town at the moment, people will need to be a little more vigilant in making reports and identifying offenders, before the problem worsens.
- Something which most people are aware of, and which I will bring to your attention to refresh your memory. There are a number of poppy crops beginning to reach maturity throughout the valley. All paddocks will display a warning sign and clearly outline that it is an offence to take or possess the poppies. For your own information, it is a very serious offence to take poppies, and an offender will be charged with a number of offences including stealing (Criminal Code), trespass, possess prohibited plant and/or possessing part of a prohibited plant. A magistrate will look on the matter very seriously, and further, the consumption of poppies can cause injury or death.
- ◆ A final matter for the Christmas period. Possessing an open container or drinking intoxicating liquor in the street is an offence. Persons found to be doing this will be charged with the appropriate offences. Prohibiting this type of behaviour will also assist in keeping the streets clean of bottles and cans and associated rubbish.

Your help and patience over Christmas will be much appreciated. From all at St Marys Police Station, have a happy and safe Christmas. Luke Rockliffe.




