Events board for town

The St Marys Town Theme Committee has asked Council to obtain a costing for three Events Boards to be located at each entrance to the town, to allow events taking place in the town to be publicised to through traffic, events such as the Winter Solstice Celebrations, the New Years Day Races, the Spring Festival, the Christmas Parade etc.

It is envisaged that the boards would be about 1400 mm square. When not in use for event publicity, it is suggested

that the fixed backboard would read Welcome to St Marys or similar.

Organisations conducting events would have their own notice board signs prepared, which would be slid in front of the backboard for an appropriate period before the event, and then removed the day after the event was completed.

Comment and suggestions are invited from members of the community on this idea, and as always input to the Town Theme Committee is encouraged from the community.

"Apparently what is happening is that we take your photo and then the documentation is forwarded to Service Tasmania and onward to the Department of Infrastructure, they then scan the polaroid photograph which we have already taken. This photograph is kept on file for 3 years and if in the meantime you loose your Drivers Licence, the photograph will be on file

"We know this will assist the public greatly in that you will not have to make a special trip to Service Tasmania at St Helens, also I hope that this has not caused too many hassles for too many people".

To the Community of St Marys

This is the first report of SMACD for 2002. SMACD has been running workshops to understand the roles and responsibilities of community organisations, such as SMACD.

Those who have participated have gained a great deal of knowledge, both educational and structural, thanks to Break O'Day Facilitator Mr Neil Butterworth.

We have also been looking at in house structure and how we see the future as in the big picture. As St Marys sits at the moment600 residents and how many community groups? If we can coordinate our groups so we have a progress association with one representative from all committees who could gather possibly quarterly and share resources and help each other with projects, there could be a greater strength in workforce, better membership numbers, greater political clout, more facilities and equipment available, greater access to the peoples requirements, all to which most of our small groups would benefit.

Our town could only be advantaged as these people could help coordinate a direction and development for all projects current or pending. We could reduce insurance premiums, have blanket funding opportunities, greater town vision, stop treading on toes of other organisations, coordinate fund raising events, better use of town resources, enhance volunteer base, and just increase our strength as a community as a whole. The disadvantages to this idea or threats are, as we see, parochialism (them & us), strong personalities, maintaining a momentum, and the initial coordination of the group.

If our community wants to move on stronger we need to be represented by all groups and have an input in the community and it's politics. Most areas are represented, but they are not coordinated with the 'big picture'.

Each of these groups are strong in their idea and all of our individual groups have passion to their individual cause, and all are well known for their achievements, now is the time our community should act for the benefit as a whole.

SMACD would like to invite representatives from all groups within our community to discuss community progress options and open the subject for discussion by the wider community.



So this is America!

Peta continues her story

Pulling up at the Long Island University and seeing all those old buildings so rich in architecture, lit up by flood lights, was like something you would see in a movie. Next was to drag— and I mean drag, suitcases up three flights of stairs to the top level dormitory where we were staying.

My dormitory had 4 bedrooms and one bathroom and I shared with five Australians and two Peruvian girls. After a good nights sleep, we went to breakfast at the University cafeteria then wandered around the campus in the snow, saw a few squirrels which were cute and real bazaar with their movements. We found a bus that took us to the nearest mall in Hicksville, on the way we stopped at a place called Old Westbury where Gwyneth Paltrow did a shoot for Vanity Fair. Next on the agenda was to buy some warmer clothes and thanks to American Eagle and JC Penney, I found just what I was looking for. By the time I got back to the University the European Au Pairs had arrived. Some of the nationalities included Czech Republic, German, Polish, Swedish and Hungarian.

A typical day was, getting up at 7 am, breakfast and in class by 8 am, finishing class at 6 pm, dinner then rest of the evening free. On the Thursday we were given the afternoon off class and went on an excursion to the Big Apple! We travelled through the district of Queens which consisted of big brick buildings, all the trees were dark with no leaves, not much beauty in this district in the middle of winter.

We crossed over one of the bridges and saw the biggest cemetery you could ever imagine. Next on to the island of Manhattan. You really do not know where to look first, you pass all the famous streets such as 5th Avenue.

I saw Donald Trump's 'Trump Towers', walked around busy Time Square and Central Park. Saw the NBC studios where Katie Couric and Matt Laver work. We passed many 'Starbucks' and 'Dean & Deluca' coffee houses, were shown Val Kilmer's

While our tour group was being shown around the city, we were approached by a woman who asked us if we wanted to sit in the audience while they taped a screening of the 'Queen Latifan' show. Queen Latifan is a singer and actress and is in the 'The Bone Collector', so we went to see it taped. We were taken to the Chelsea Television studios in a huge black stretch limo, had to go through a security check point then wait in a room before being ushered into an elevator and taken to our seats to wait until Queen Latifan came out. She was a very nice lady and I thought, wow this is the first celebrity I have seen.

After the show we wandered around New York City, and I have to say it is not as rough as people say it is of a night. We went to a big store called 'Macy's' and bought some Calvin Klein tops and continued on to some small little shops which sold postcards and other touristy things. Before catching a bus back to Long Island we walked to the Empire State Building.

The next morning was our final class and after saying our goodbyes I caught a bus to La Guardia airport to wait for my one hour flight to Detroit – Douglas International Airport then another flight to Charlotte.

Jim my host Dad met me at the airport and on the drive to his home, he told me about a 'Hornet' basket-ball player in the NBA who was currently on trial for the murder of his girlfriend. I thought great! Welcome to America.

Jim and Barbara's place was an absolutely beautiful home, but within 20 minutes of meeting the little girl I was to look after, I thought what ever have I done!

The best part of staying at Jim and Barbara's house was that I had an apartment all to myself and after a good nights sleep I felt better and hoped that last night with the little girl was just a one off deal!

My Au Pair buddy Kelly who was also a Tassie girl had called and was coming to take me for a look around Charlotte. Even in winter Charlotte is a very pretty city, the temperature of an evening was about—2° c and during the day you wear at least a skivvy or jacket.

I had my first Au Pair meeting on Sunday, it was only my second day in Charlotte. An Au Pair meeting takes place once a month as part of our program and we were not allowed to miss more than 3 meetings a year. My time at Jim and Barbara's was short lived, so I was moved thankfully to another family whom I had met through my buddy Kelly. My new family were Debra and Randy Peele. Debra is a Sales/advertising executive with ADVO and Randy is basketball coach and scout for Virginia Tech—a large college in Virginia.

Year 10 rural students

The University Department of Rural Health's Health Careers Workshop is a free residential workshop held annually for year 10 rural high school students. In 2002 the workshop will be held from Monday 13 May to Friday 17 May at Camp Clayton in Ulverstone.

This workshop is a valuable opportunity for young people interested in a career in health. Activities include information, practical sessions with qualified health professionals and recreational activities.

In 2002 sessions will include Medicine, Nursing, Physiotherapy, Occupational Therapy, Podiatry, Dentistry, Speech Pathology, Dietetics, Ambulance.

Many schools consider the workshop an extension of their work experience program. Students receive a certificate of participation.

Year 10 students who attend a school outside of Launceston and Hobart are eligible to apply. There are twenty places available.

School register

In 1909 the Admission Register for St Marys State School shows the "Last School" of some pupils newly registered as "St Patrick's Head School", John Findlay, Clement Strochnetter, Ralph, Gordon and Dorothea Strochnetter, William, Henry and Arthur Ford and Doris Coward, even though they may have been resident at "Irishtown".

In the 1850's Irishtown was still referred to as "St Patrick's Valley" (was Irishtown referred to as such locally around 1870's as a balance to the newly named German Town?), and the river was 'St Patrick's River' until it was renamed St Marys Rivulet shortly after the township of St Marys was surveyed in 1857.
